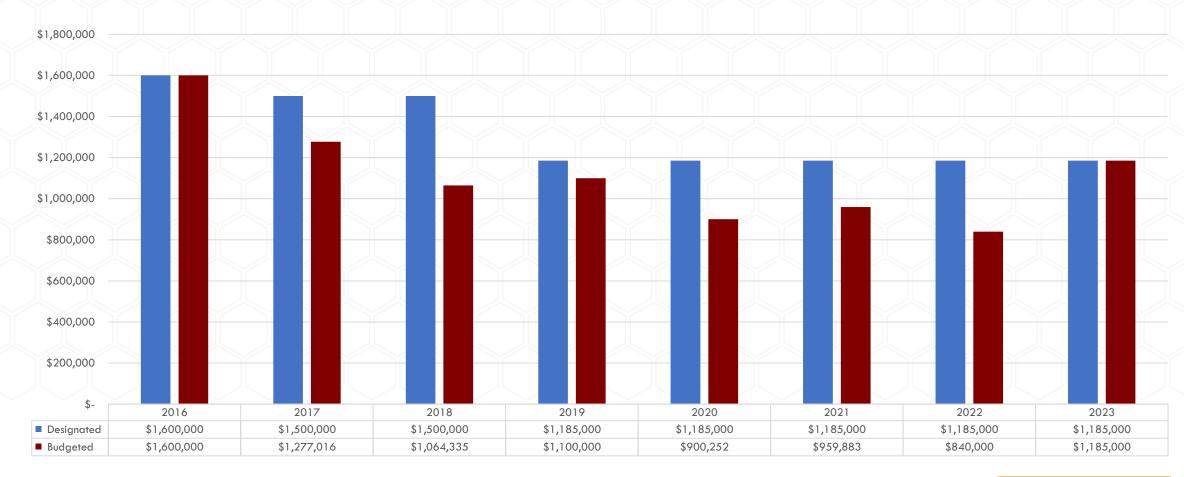

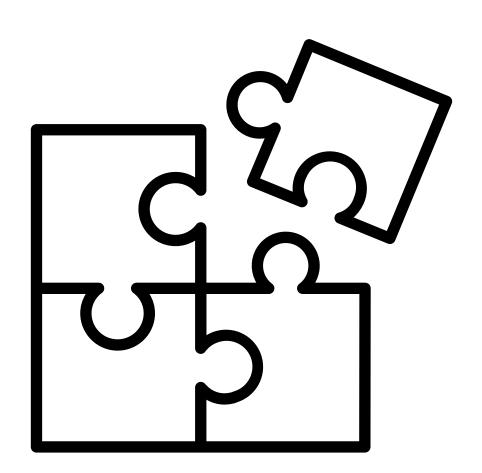
Total 2023 new requests comply with legislative intent setting a ceiling of \$1,185,000 on Regional Projects funding.

SLCo was awarded a \$19.6M FLAP grant to make roadway and related improvements in Upper Millcreek Canyon. The grant requires a non-federal match, of which this is the second of two appropriation requests to meet the match requirement. \$2.5M was appropriated in 2022.

# 2023 ARPA New Requests Summary

- Pre-Apprenticeship Program,
  \$1,402,350 (total request over 2 years is \$2,788,630)
- Includes 1 time-limited FTE

### Pre-Apprenticeship Program

#### Problem

• One of SLCo's largest gaps in workforce readiness is the lack of pre-apprenticeship programs.

#### Solution

- This grant funding would support Salt Lake County residents' participation in programming that prepares them for apprenticeships that result in high-quality jobs and careers.
- The program proposal includes 1 time-limited FTE to administer the program.

**4,400** the number of active apprentices in Utah today.

**261** the number of registered apprenticeship programs in the state.

\$300,000 the average additional lifetime earnings of apprenticeship participants.



### Pre-Apprenticeship Program

#### Impact

• The Pre-Apprenticeship Program will be administered through grant awards to community-based organizations with demonstrated success in 1) administering similar workforce readiness programs and 2) serving households or populations facing negative economic impacts due to COVID-19 and/or those earning less than 300% of Federal Poverty Guidelines.

#### Outcome

• A minimum of 330 low-income SLCo residents participating in a pre-apprenticeship program, resulting in the opportunity to enter an established apprenticeship program and the potential to earn thousands in additional lifetime earnings.
