RESOLUTION NO. 5790

EXTENSION OF THE STATE OF EMERGENCY DECLARED BY THE SALT LAKE COUNTY MAYOR ARISING OUT OF THE SEPTEMBER 8, 2020 WINDSTORM

A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF SALT LAKE COUNTY, BE IT KNOWN AND REMEMBERED:

THAT, the County Council of Salt Lake County, State of Utah, met in regular session of the Council on the 6th day of October, 2020.

WITNESS:

WHEREAS, on September 8, 2020, hurricane force winds struck Salt Lake County causing widespread damage to trees and buildings and power outages throughout the County leading to business and school closures; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Utah Code Annotated, Sections 53-2a-205 and -208, the Mayor of Salt Lake County has the power to declare a state of emergency for Salt Lake County; and

WHEREAS, Section 2.86.030, Salt Lake County Code of Ordinances, 2001, authorizes the Mayor to declare that a state of emergency exists in Salt Lake County and to invoke certain powers in aid of responding to and mitigating such emergency; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor issued a Proclamation Declaring a State of Emergency and Invoking Emergency Powers in Salt Lake County on September 9, 2020 based upon the damage caused by the windstorm; and

WHEREAS, Salt Lake County, other governmental entities in Salt Lake County and private property owners suffered economic damage due to the windstorm; and

WHEREAS, Salt Lake County continues to investigate, review and mitigate the damage caused by the windstorm; and

WHEREAS, the total amount of damage is still being calculated; and

WHEREAS, State law and County ordinance permit the Mayor's declaration of an emergency to be effective for a period not to exceed 30 days, unless the emergency declaration is continued or renewed with the consent of the County Council.

RESOLUTION:

NOW, THEREFORE, THE FOLLOWING IS RESOLVED:

1. The County Council of Salt Lake County hereby finds that a State of Emergency continues to exist in and for Salt Lake County due to the windstorm.
2. The Council acknowledges and supports invoking the emergency powers and operations of the County by the Mayor.
3. The Council supports the County's utilization of its personnel and resources, as ordered and authorized by the Mayor, to perform all functions

specified in County Ordinance 2.86.050 and in other applicable provisions of law.

4. This Resolution shall take effect immediately and be declared to be ongoing and continuing until Midnight on Sunday, November 8, 2020, unless ended earlier as determined by the Mayor.

5. This Resolution shall be provided to the State of Utah and the Mayor and shall be filed immediately with the Salt Lake County Clerk and published by general dissemination as appropriate.

W I T N E S S E T H

WHEREAS, Salt Lake County (the “County”) and the Salt Lake City (the City) are “public agencies” as defined by the Utah Interlocal Cooperation Act, Utah Code Ann. §§ 11-13-101 *et seq.* (the “Cooperation Act”), and, as such, are authorized by the Cooperation Act to enter into an interlocal cooperation agreement to act jointly and cooperatively on the basis of mutual advantage;

WHEREAS, during the 2015 General Session, the State Legislature amended Section 72- 2-117.5 of the Utah Transportation Code (Utah Code Ann. §§ 72-1-101 *et seq.*) to provide corridor preservation funds to local counties for disbursement to various cities and governmental entities, as recommended and endorsed by a council of governments (hereinafter “Corridor Preservation Funds”); and

WHEREAS, by letter dated and attached hereto as **ATTACHMENT A** (the “Recommendation Letter”), the Salt Lake County Council of Governments (COG), an association of local governments in Salt Lake County, requested that the County Council approve its recommended distribution to the City from the Salt Lake County Corridor Preservation Fund to enable the City to acquire property needed for a transportation project considered and approved by COG at approximately 5448 South 700 West, Salt Lake City, Utah, consistent with the purpose and requirements of Section 72-2-117.5; and

WHEREAS, the County and the City now desire to enter into the interlocal cooperation agreement attached hereto as **ATTACHMENT B** (the “Interlocal Agreement”) providing for the transfer of Six Hundred and Eleven Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$611,500.00) of Corridor Preservation Funds to the City to be used by the City as described in the Interlocal Agreement and in accordance with Section 72-2-117.5 of the Utah Transportation Code.

R E S O L U T I O N

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED, by the County Council of Salt Lake County:

1. That the recommendation of the Salt Lake County Council of Governments to transfer County Corridor Preservation Funds to the Salt

RESOLUTION NO. 5793

A RESOLUTION OF THE SALT LAKE COUNTY COUNCIL DECLARING SURPLUS REAL PROPERTY AND APPROVING THE CONVEYANCE OF THE SAME BY QUIT-CLAIM DEED TO ALEXANDRE U. VIAU AND MACKENZIE P. STUNKARD

RECITALS

1. Salt Lake County (the “County”) owns a small parcel of real property, Parcel No. 22-35-253-039, located at approximately 3195 East Deercreek Cir., Cottonwood Heights, Utah (the “Property”), which was struck off to the County after the tax sale in 1992.

2. Alexandre U. Viau and Mackenzie P. Stunkard, as joint tenants (“Buyers”) own a parcel of land adjacent to the Property.
3. Buyers have offered to purchase the Property from the County for the agreed upon purchase price, which has been reviewed and approved by the Salt Lake County Real Estate Division, and has paid a fee of \$100, which amount shall be credited towards the purchase prices of the Property. This offer is in the form of a Tax Sale Property Purchase Agreement (the “Agreement”) attached hereto as Exhibit A.
4. The taxes, interest, and fees (including deed and tax sale administrative fees) owed at the time of the 1992 tax sale amount to \$479.62.
5. The County has determined that the Property is not currently in public use and that the Property has a value of \$227.62. To accommodate this value, it has been recommended that the difference between the property value and the taxes, interest, and fees owed at the time of the tax sale in 1992 should be waived in order to consummate this purchase. The amount that will be waived is \$252.00 ($\$479.62 - \$227.62 = \252.00). Proceeds from the sale of the Property will be distributed in accordance with Section 59-2-1351.5 of the Utah Code.
6. The best interest of the County and the general public will be served by the sale and conveyance of the Property to Buyers for its fair market value. The sale and conveyance will be in compliance with all applicable state statutes and county ordinances.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED by the Salt Lake County Council that the Property described in Exhibit 1 of the Agreement is hereby declared surplus property.

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED by the Salt Lake County Council that the sale and conveyance of the Property by quit-claim deed to Buyers as provided in the Agreement for the agreed value of Two Hundred Twenty-Seven Dollars and Sixty-Two Cents (\$227.62) is hereby approved; that the remaining \$252.00 owed as of the 1992 tax sale is waived, and the Mayor is hereby authorized to execute the Agreement and the Mayor and County Clerk are authorized to execute the Quit-Claim Deed, attached to the Agreement as Exhibit 2, and to deliver the fully executed documents to the Salt Lake

County Real Estate Division for delivery to Buyers in accordance with the terms of the Agreement.
