




# **Declining Student Enrollment**



### **20-Year Enrollment**




### 20-Year Enrollment + 5-Year Forecast

### **Reminder about Student-Teacher Ratio**

#### **More students = more teachers**

### Fewer students = fewer teachers



# **Benefits of Consolidation**


Include, but are not limited to:

- >Having an average of 500-550 students allows an elementary school to staff at a minimum of three teachers per grade level
- > No split grade-level classrooms
- Provides more parental choice to match learning style and decrease personality conflicts
- > Professional Learning Communities and overall collaboration are much more effective
- >Balances out classroom size

## Benefits of Consolidation...cont.

- > The economy of scale provides more funds for extra staffing and program supports
- Easier to maintain larger and more effective SCC's, PTA's and other parent volunteer efforts because there are simply more parents to draw from
- > Teacher workload and burnout is decreased more teachers and staff to fulfill committee assignments required for all schools
- More efficient use of administrator-to-student-and-teacher ratios(e.g., one principal for a school of 250 students or one principal for a school of 500 students?)
- > Schools are appropriately sized to host programs like Dual-Language-Immersion
- > More inclusion opportunities for SPED students
- >More fiscally responsible use of district resources
