Department of State (1999-2010)

In early 1999, I was accepted into a State Department internship program in the International Organizations bureau. At the conclusion of my three-month internship, the Department hired me to assist in Security Council-related issues at the U.S. Mission to the UN. During this time, I was accepted into a Ph.D. program in London and, the following year, awarded a Fulbright Scholarship in the Netherlands. In 2000, I passed the Foreign Service written and oral exams (Political Cone) and was placed on the eligible hires list for new political officers while my Top Secret security clearance was being processed. Then 9/11 happened. The Department asked me to return to New York in fall 2001 to accept a policy position in the Political Affairs Section of the U.S. Mission to the UN.

Given new national security priorities focused on Al Qaeda and international counter-terrorism initiatives, the Department assigned me to lead U.S. efforts in the UN Security Council to freeze and block Al Qaeda-linked assets. In this role as the U.S. representative on the UN Security Council's Al Qaeda and Taliban Sanctions Committee, I drafted and negotiated Chapter VII UN Security Council resolutions. I was also a member of the U.S. Mission to UN's Iraq team in the run up to the Iraq War. Much of my work in this period focused on the UN Oil-for-Food Program and international sanctions regime on Iraq, in addition to overall counter-terrorism strategy in the multilateral setting.

My follow-on State Department assignments included seven consecutive years in Iraq and Afghanistan (2003-2010):

Coalition Provisional Authority, Baghdad (2003)

I was part of a small State Department contingent in Baghdad beginning in summer 2003 based at the Coalition Provisional Authority (CPA), which oversaw the U.S. administration of Iraq. I was assigned to work with Iraq's truckers in order to help ensure the movement of food and supplies across the country as the insurgency gained strength.

This was a sensitive and demanding job given the deteriorating security situation and rising discontent among large parts of the Iraqi population.

Fallujah, Iraq (2004-2007)

In summer 2004, Amb. John Negroponte asked me to be the State Department representative in Fallujah, where I acted as the political adviser to the commanding general (Gen. James Conway) of U.S. troops in western Iraq (mostly Marines, who numbered approximately 38,000 at the time). I reported directly to the embassy political counselor, Amb. Robert Ford, and Amb. Negroponte in Baghdad. I was responsible for devising the political strategy in Anbar Province, particularly in and around Fallujah. This period included "Operation Al Fajr" or "New Dawn" -- the biggest battle of the Iraq War. With Marines and soldiers, I helped lead U.S. efforts to rebuild the city and engage with local political, tribal, and religious leaders. This job involved coordinating with the U.S. military the actions of thousands of troops and millions of dollars in U.S. reconstruction funds. The State Department awarded me the Secretary of State's Medal for Heroism for my work with the U.S. military in Fallujah and Anbar Province.

Khost Province, Afghanistan (2007-2008)

Upon leaving Fallujah in February 2007, the U.S. ambassador in Kabul (Amb. Ronald Neumann) asked me to be part of his forward-deployed team in Afghanistan. I represented the State Department for almost a year and a half in Khost Province located on the eastern edge of Afghanistan and one-time home of Osama bin Laden and Jalaluddin Haqqani. My work centered on Pashtun tribal engagement and close coordination across all political and military issues with Governor Arsala Jamal, the top Afghan official in the region. In my related role on the Khost Provincial Reconstruction Team, I helped direct approximately \$50 million in reconstruction funds on high-priority projects, such as roads and other infrastructure, education, and reconciliation initiatives with former Taliban fighters. I focused my political reporting (cables to Washington) on "human capital" areas, such as engagement with university students, Khost University professors, ex-Taliban fighters, madrassa students and mullahs, and key Pashtun tribal leaders.

Sadr City, Iraq (2008-2009)

Midway through my second year in Khost, Ambassador Robert Ford requested I return to Iraq to join the embassy's Political Section in October 2008, where he was again serving as the political counselor. Much like my role in Sunni-dominated Fallujah, I represented the State Department in this Shia section of Baghdad, home to millions of Iraqis who had been repressed under Saddam Hussein. My work focused on engaging local leaders in advance of an upcoming Iraqi election and impending U.S. troop drawdown. The embassy assigned me to determine the best way to reduce the U.S. military presence in the violent area. I also advocated a shift in policy to manage more effectively U.S. reconstruction funds (tens of millions of dollars) at a time when U.S. policy prioritized pressing the Iraqi central government to do more with its own resources.

Helmand Province, Afghanistan (2009-2010)

In spring 2009, while I was based in Iraq, the Marine commanding general of the 2nd Marine Expeditionary Brigade, then BGen. Larry Nicholson, requested that I be assigned to work with him as the State Department representative at Camp Leatherneck. (He and I had first worked closely together in Fallujah in 2006-2007, an especially red year in which we suffered 93 KIA in one Marine regiment.) The State Department approved my transfer. At the time, U.S. troop levels numbered just under 11,000 in Helmand Province. Within six months, BGen. Nicholson and I were overseeing a surge of troops into the Central Helmand River Valley, whose numbers rose to approximately 20,000 as President Obama escalated the war. The general's and my primary tasks included formulating counterinsurgency strategies in coordination with local leaders and the British government, which had ordered almost 10,000 of its own troops into the poppyfilled area. One of the biggest battles of the Afghanistan War (in a place called Marjah) occurred during the Marines' deployment and my time with them. I collaborated closely with Helmand Governor Mangal during this period, in addition to UK diplomats based in the provincial capital, Lashkar Gah. Helmand was the most violent province in the country during our time there, with the highest casualty count (KIA and WIA) among U.S. troops and British forces.

Private Sector: Caerus Associates and Deloitte Consulting Washington, DC (2010-2015)

Based on my decade-long career in the State Department and assignments in some difficult places in Iraq and Afghanistan, I decided it was time to leave government service and begin to reflect, analyze, and write about these experiences. (Books being, I believe, their own kind of public service.) I wanted to focus on lessons learned and apply them more formally to the policymaking process. After resigning from the State Department in 2010, I worked as a consultant in the private sector for two companies: Caerus Associates, 2010-2013 (founded by Dr. David Kilcullen) followed by Deloitte Consulting, 2013-2015.

Knopf Doubleday Publisher Penguin Random House New York, NY (2012-present)

While transitioning from the private sector, I worked with a literary agent to sell a nonfiction book to Alfred A. Knopf, an imprint of Penguin Random House. I completed the 200,000-word manuscript in late summer 2015. Several rounds of editing followed through early 2016. The book is titled, *The Mirror Test: America at War in Iraq and Afghanistan*, and was published May 24, 2016. It is a first person account of America's two longest wars.
