


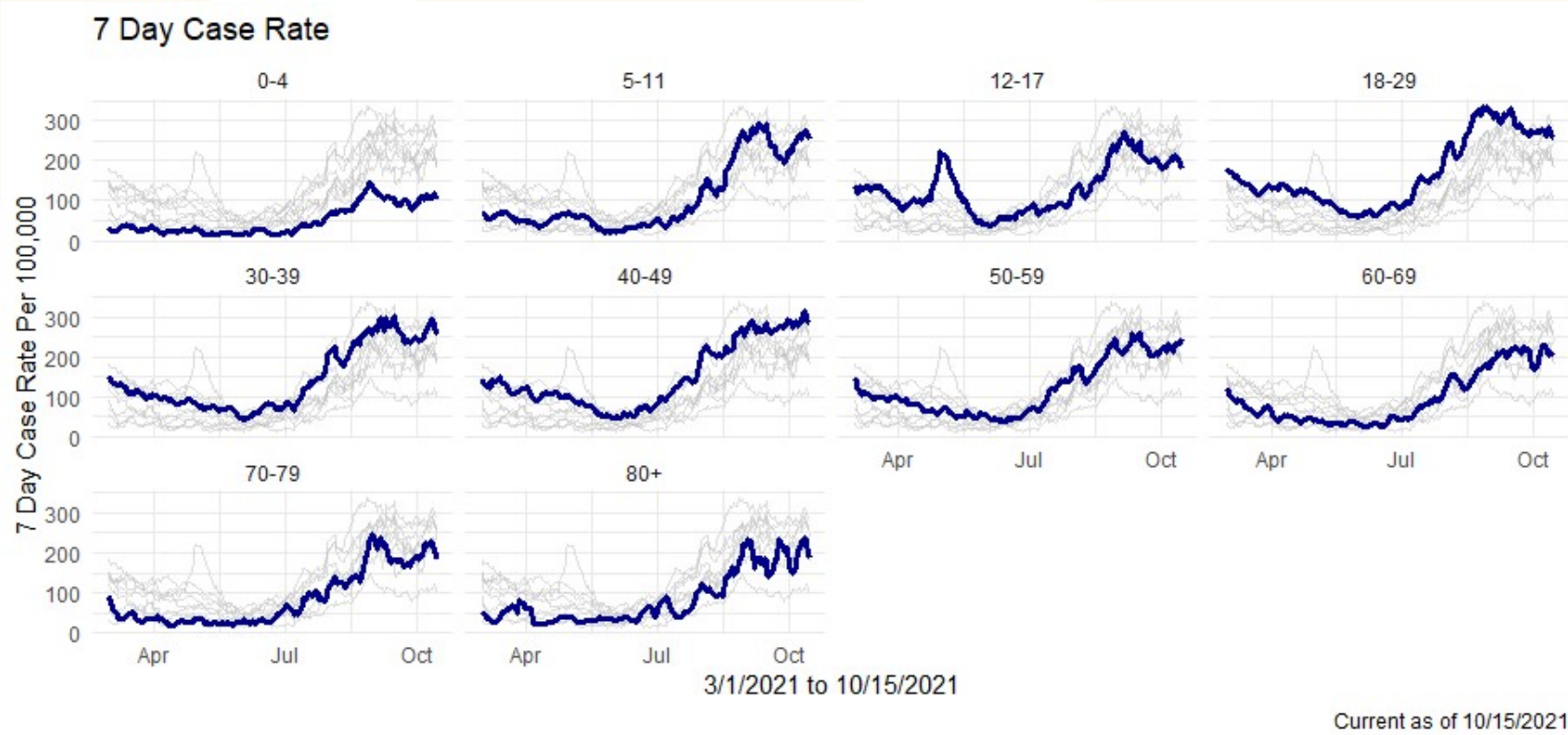

# Case Rates Are Increasing Among 5–11-year-olds

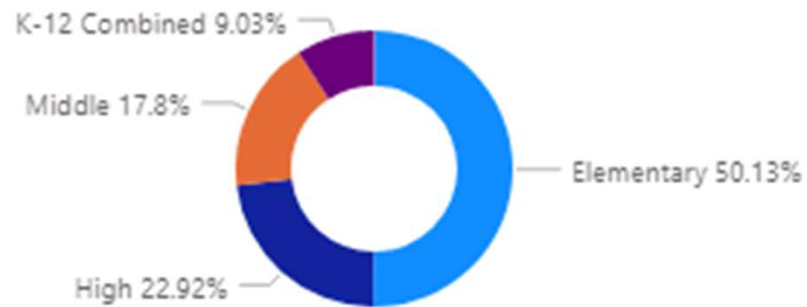

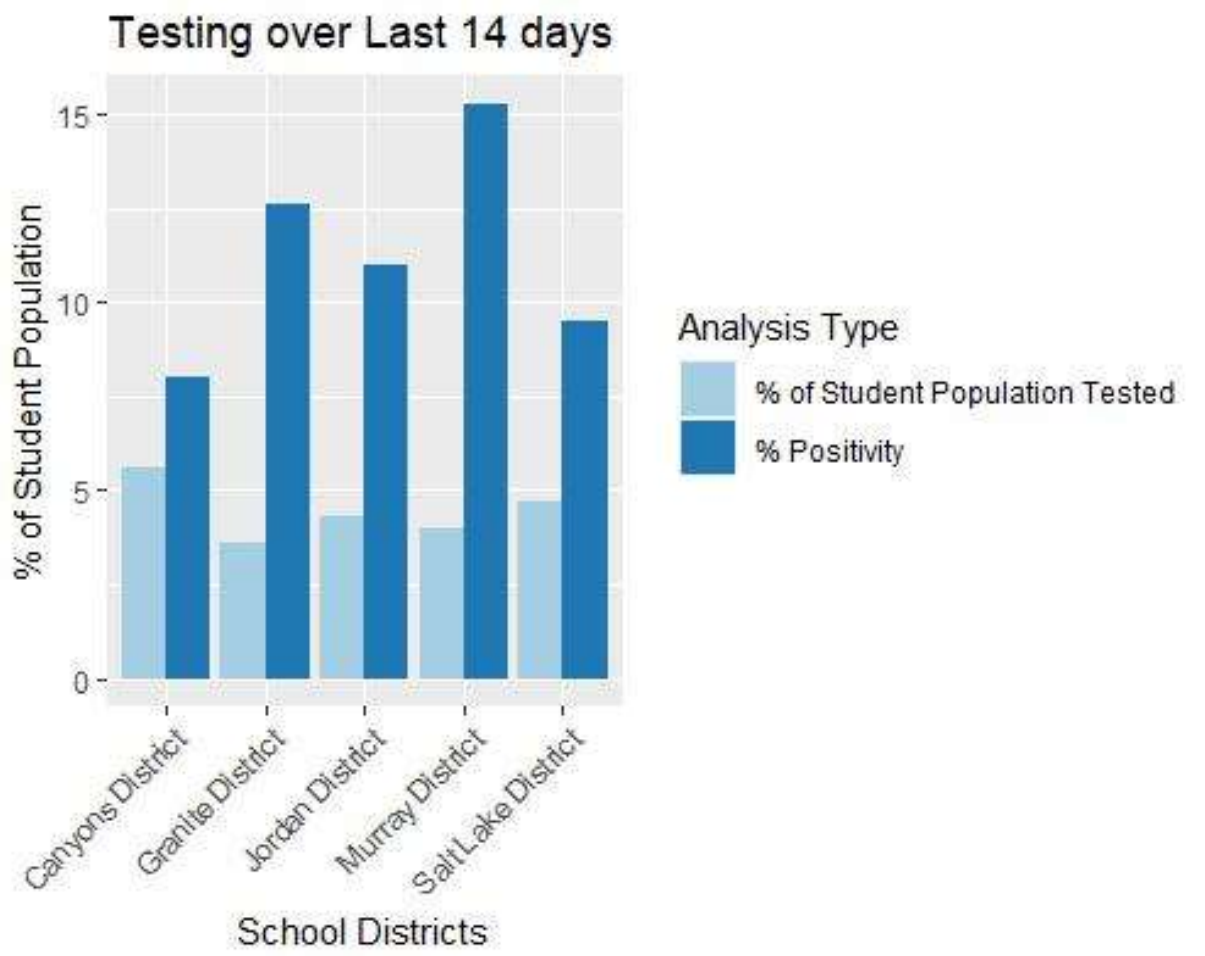

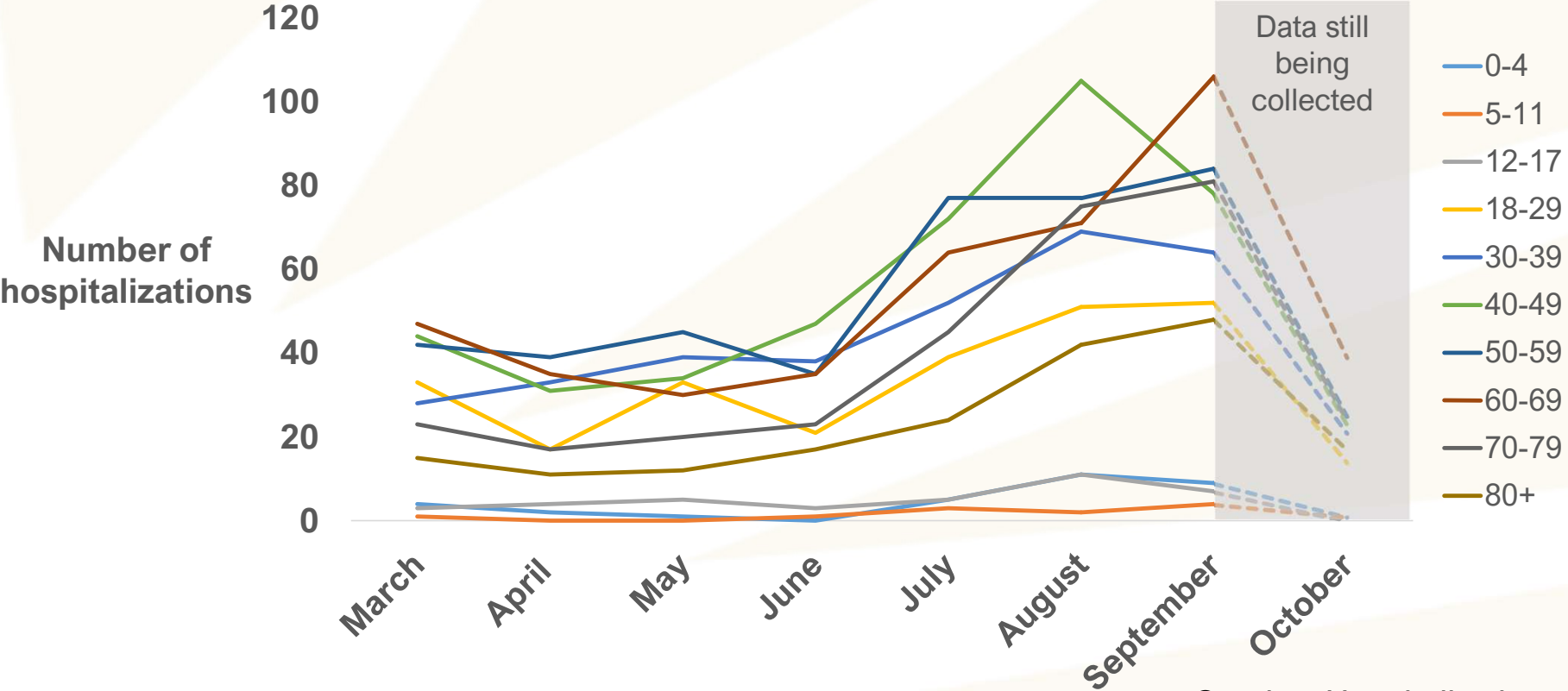
# Testing and % Positivity By School District

Number of Hospitalizations, By Age Group, March – October, 2021

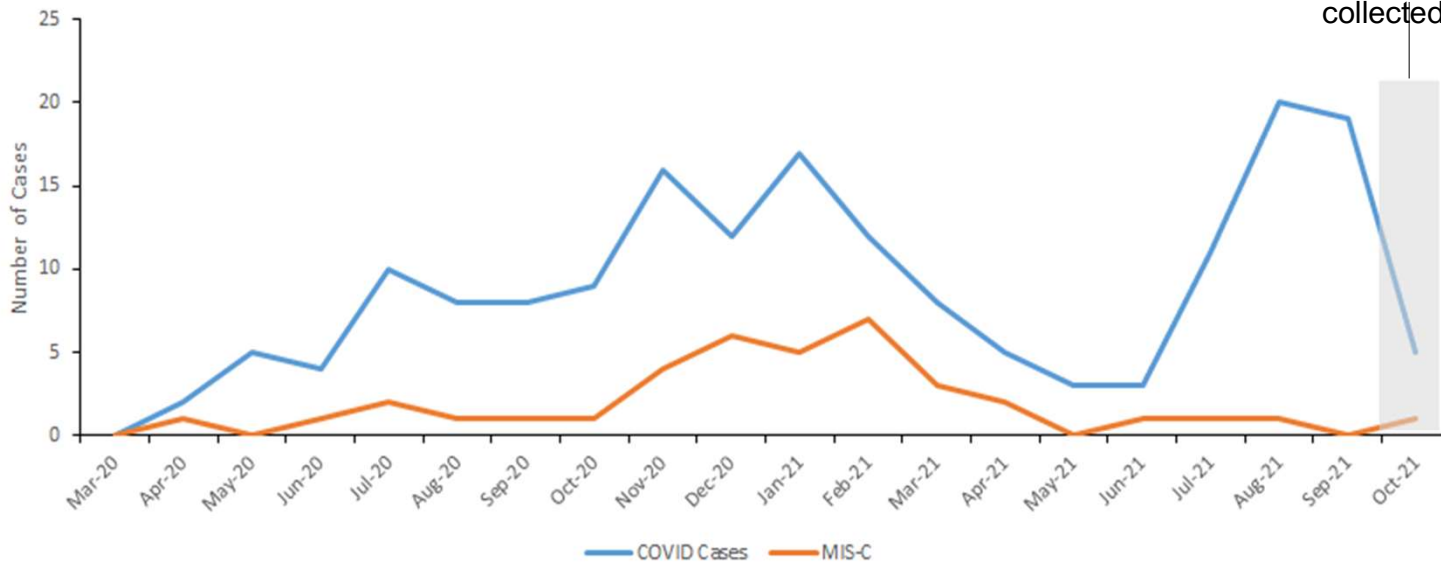

Hospitalized COVID-19 and MIS-C Cases Ages 0-17 years, Salt Lake County, UT

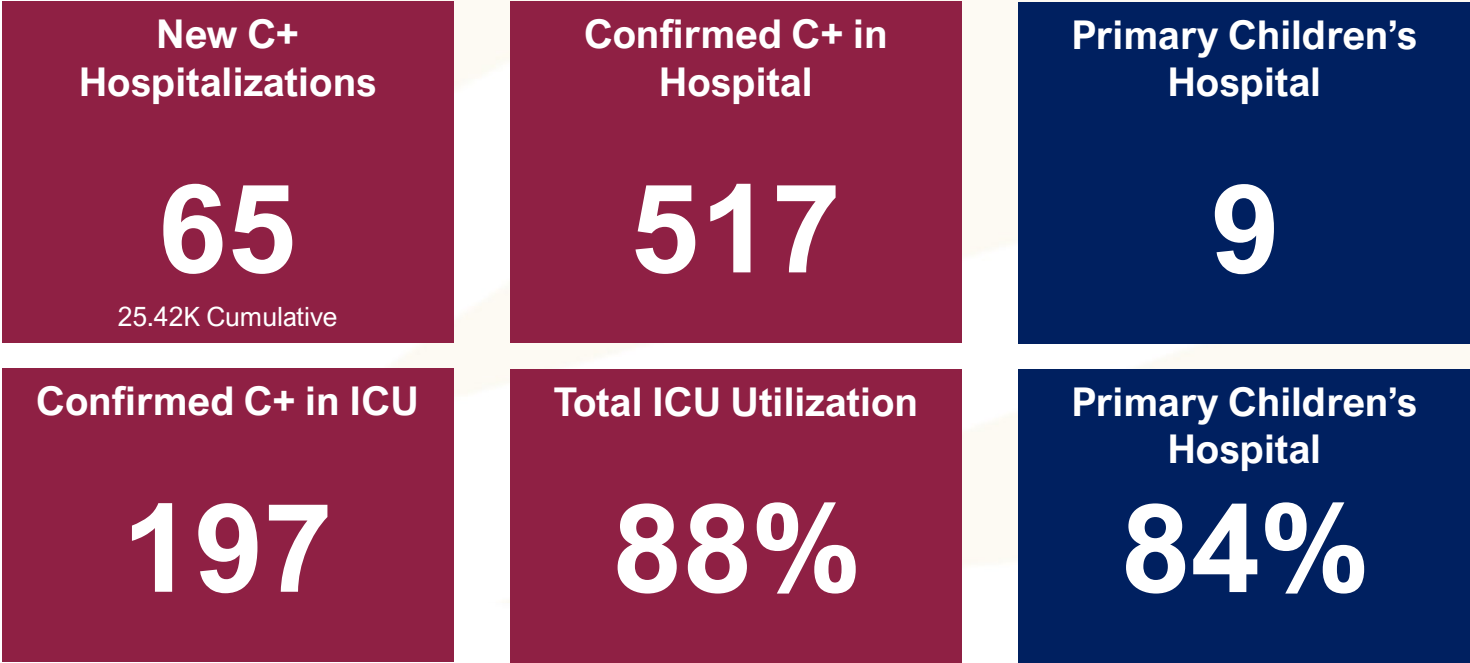

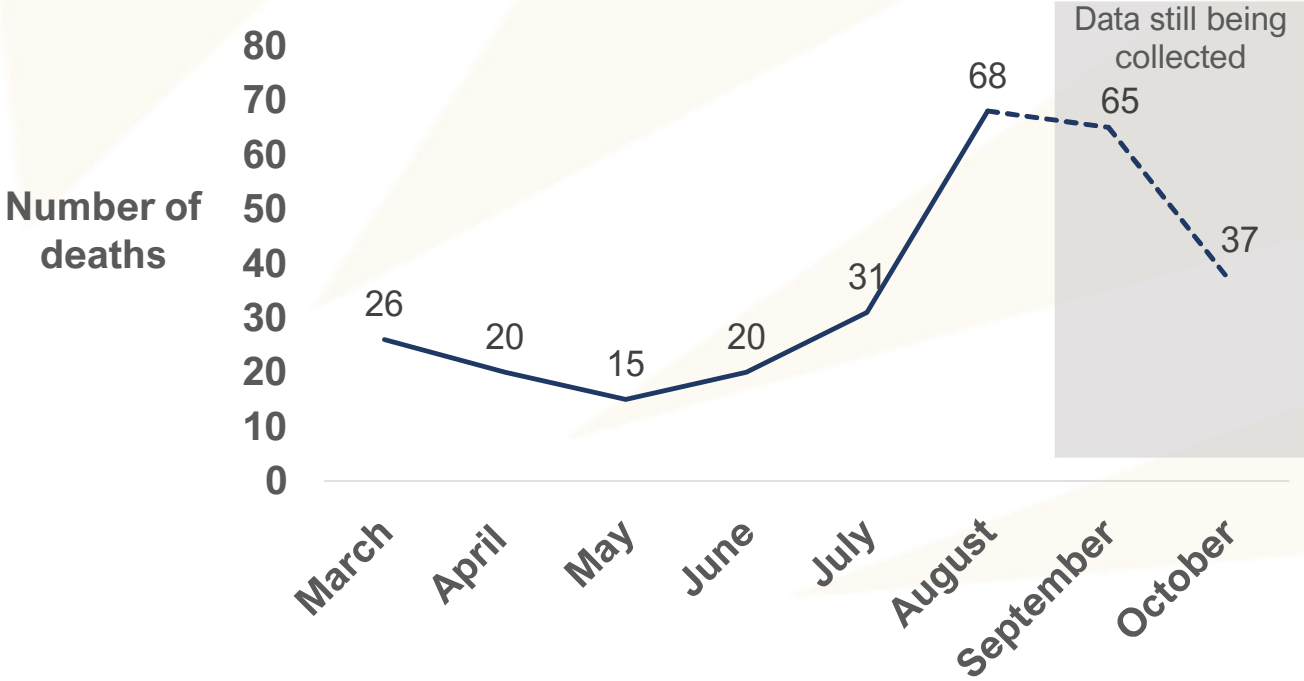

Number of COVID-19 Deaths, March – September, 2021



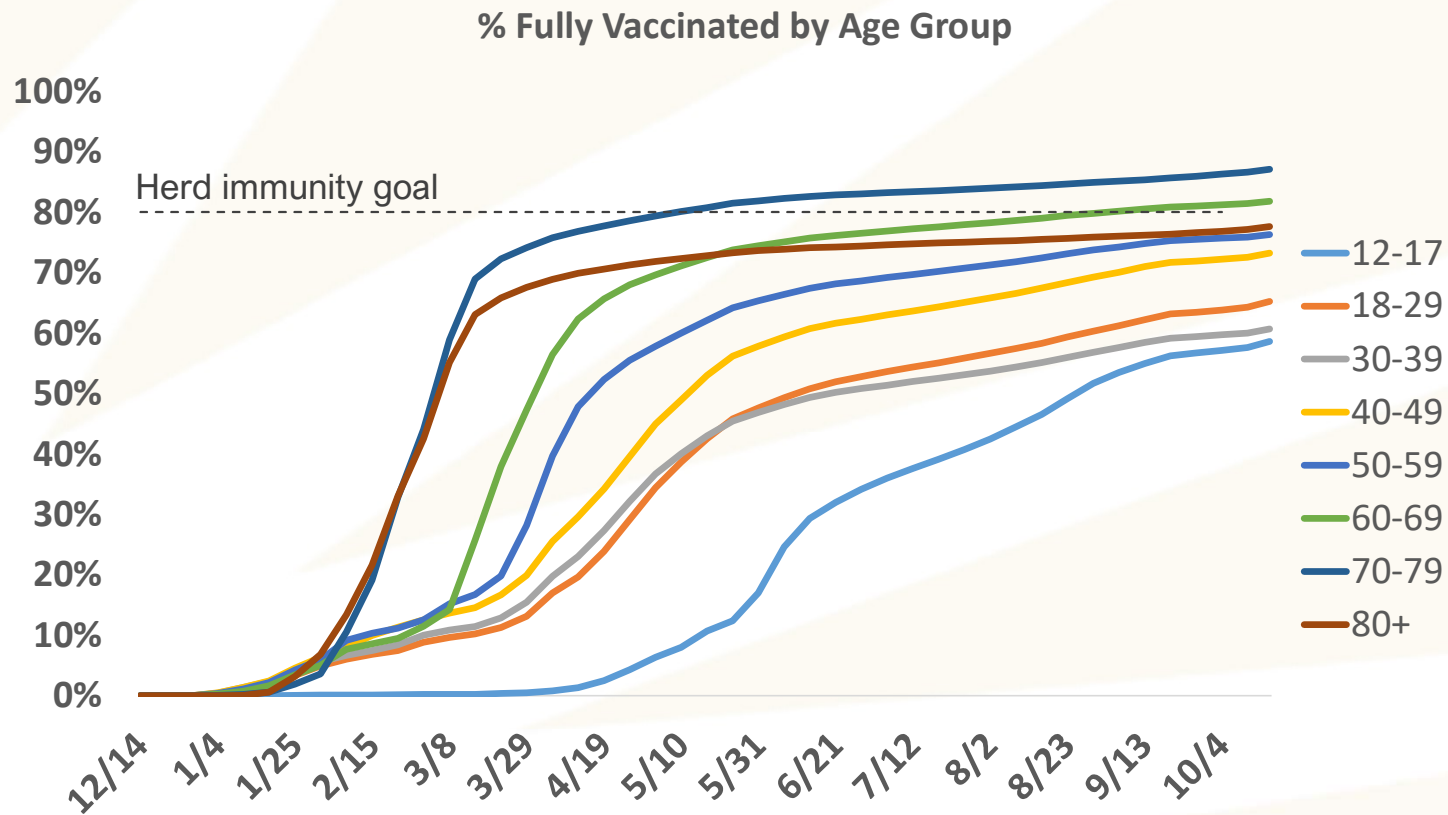

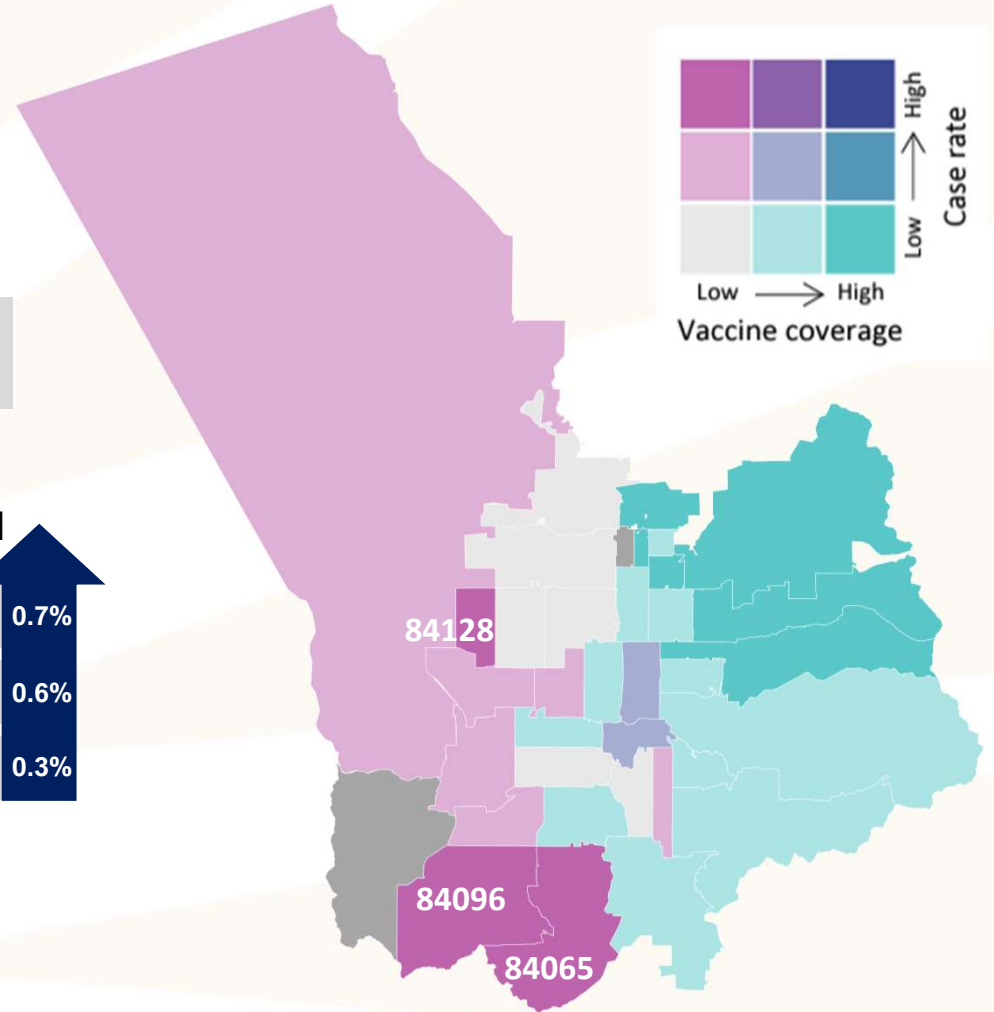
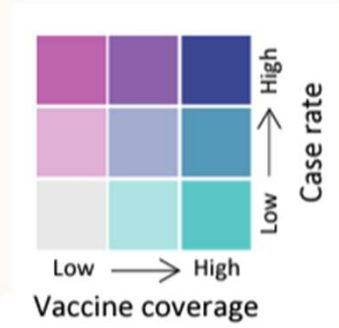
# 12-17 YO vaccinations are slightly slowing

# Monoclonal Antibody Treatment Update

- Statewide allocations based on 7-day hospitalization and case counts.
- Majority of doses being given by hospitals.
- Murray site gives doses in the tent as well as sends teams to nursing facilities as needed:
  - Two weeks ago, 54 doses were given
  - Last week 102 doses were given
- Last week 226 total treatments provided in Salt Lake County by UDOH and health care facilities.
