Budget Cuts

- Six (6) Time-Limited FTEs eliminated (\$35,554)
- Reduce OPEB Charge for 1 year (\$1,851)

Budget Neutral: No impact on General Fund

- Housing Trust Fund Administration, \$126,043/ (\$126,043)
- Environmental Program TL FTE, \$121,327/(\$121,327)
- 4th Quarter Transportation Choice Funds, \$8,871,500/(\$8,871,500)
- Expense/Revenue from SLCo Redevelopment Agency, \$100,000/(\$100,000)

*No General Fund dollars used for these purposes.

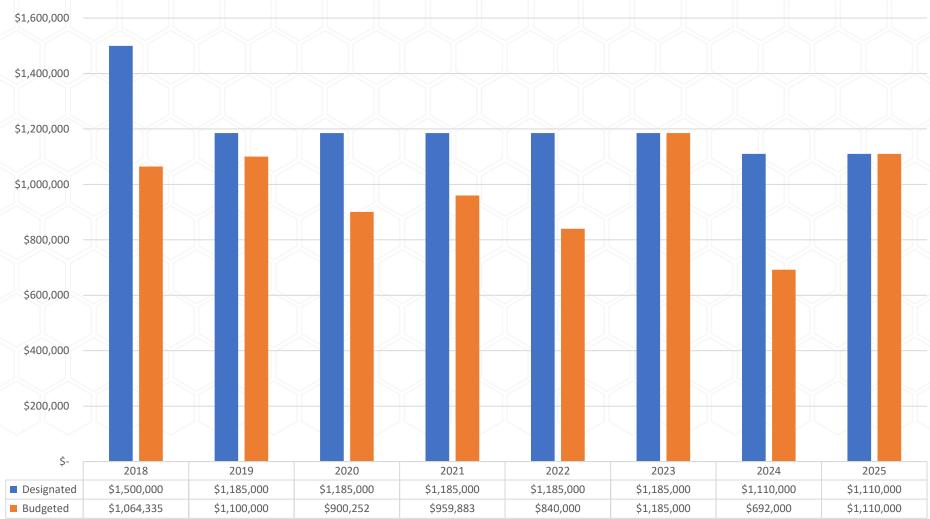
