

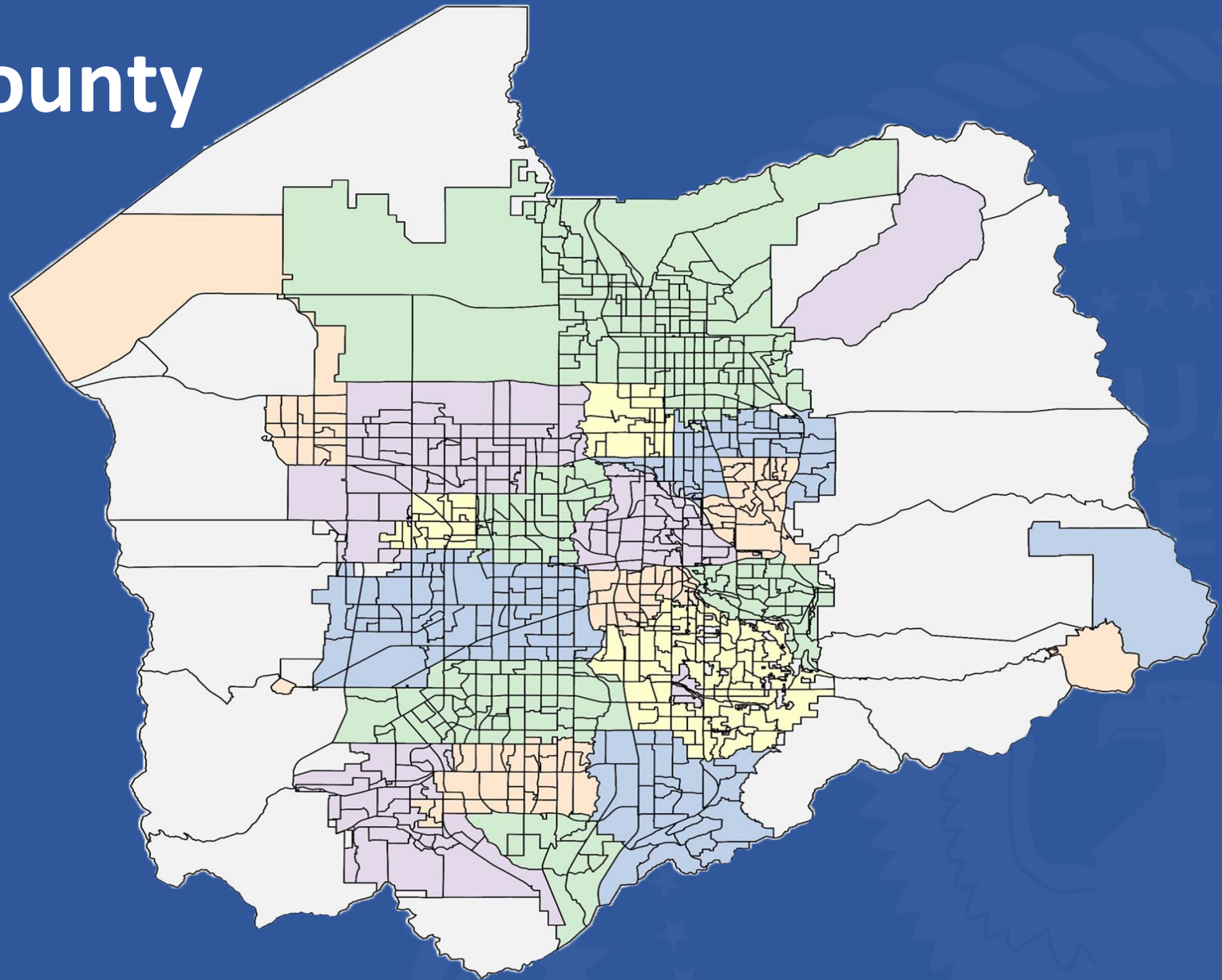

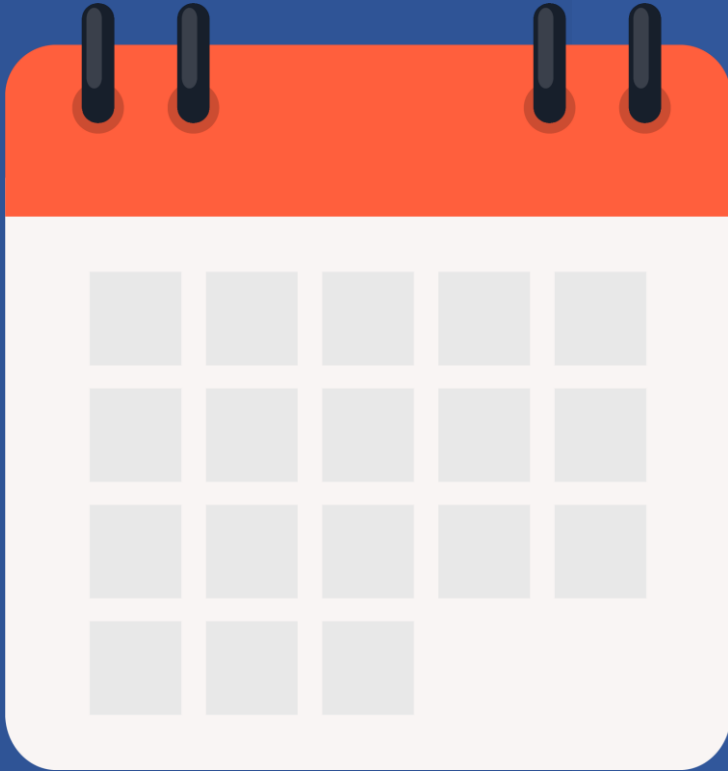

I am not a convicted felon currently incarcerated for commission of a felony. **Citizenship Affidavit:** I hereby swear and affirm, under penalties for voting fraud set forth in Utah Code Section 20A-2-401, that I am a citizen and that to the best of my knowledge and belief the information above is true and correct. In accordance with section 20A-2-401, penalty for willfully causing, procuring, or allowing yourself to be registered to vote if you know you are not entitled to vote is up to one year in jail and a fine of up to \$2,500.

Classification of Voter Records As Public Information (How to restrict access to your voter information) 9. Some information in voter registration records such as your name, address and the year of your birth has been classified as public information and would be made available to certain third parties, political parties, candidates for public office, their contractors, employees and volunteers in accordance with the requirements of Utah law. However, your driver license number, identification card number, social security number, email address and full date of birth are only available to government entities. You may request that all information on your voter registration records be withheld from all persons other than government entities, political parties, candidates for public office, their contractors, employees and their volunteers. Yes, I request that my voter information be withheld from all persons other than government entities, political parties, candidates for public office, their contractors, employees and their volunteers.

Additional Privacy Protection 10. Request for Additional Privacy Protection: In addition to the protections above, you may request that all information on your voter registration record be withheld from political candidates, their contractors, employees and volunteers by submitting a withholding person who is or is likely to be, a victim of domestic violence or dating violence. Also, a person who is, or resides with a person who is a law enforcement officer, a member of the armed forces, a public figure or protected by a protective order or a protection order may request additional privacy and protection of their records by submitting the request to the lieutenant governor or county clerk.

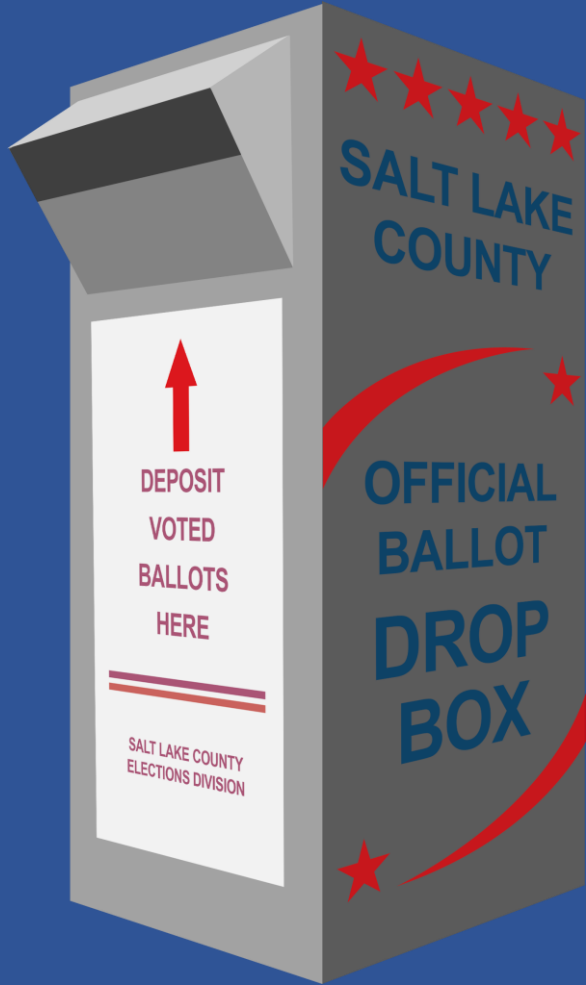

Budget Request: Fund 2024 Elections

\$4,296,040 Request for Three Major Elections Next Year:
Necessary to fulfilling our statutory duties

Major Expenses:

- Wages (including temps and poll workers)
- Printing
- Postage
- Software/Equipment
- Supplies



Wages

- Merit staff, including overtime
- Temporary staff, including staffing for 48 vote centers
- Taxes for Temp pay
- Contracted labor- UPD and Sheriff



Printing

- Voter services mailing (i.e. notifying unaffiliated voters for Primary)
- Vote by Mail Instructions, other required ballot inserts
- Ballots, security sleeves and ballot envelopes
- Outgoing and return envelopes
- Voter Rights Posters
- Vote Center Manuals for poll workers
- Ballot batch logs for processing (per new state law)



Postage



- Outgoing
- Returned mail
- Incoming ballots
- Taking advantage of bulk mail rates where possible



Software/Equipment

- Ballot construction software licensing and maintenance
- On-site/Off-site support when necessary
- AGILIS machine licensing, maintenance and parts
- Poll pad and ICX machine maintenance
- Other machine maintenance
- Computers & related equipment
- Drop box cameras



Supplies

- Office supplies
- Fire Stops
- Drop box ballot bags
- Drayage for getting materials to/from vote centers
- Mail trays/batch tubs
- Archive boxes
- Equipment transport bags
- Vote center supply tubs
- Vote center directional signs



Some Important Budget Considerations

- Voter registration & turnout increase in a Presidential year
- Potentially 3 elections instead of normal 2
- Anticipated higher volume data entry required
- Experiencing tough competition with private sector for temps
- Legislative Session 2024: Could implement new requirements/processes for election administration
 - 2023 Session passed 20+ bills related to elections- have been implementing changes this year
