The Property Tax Committee, at a meeting on January 16, 2025, considered an application for 2023 veteran exemption due to the sale of the property or other change in ownership, after the lien date. The Committee recommends that the following relief be granted:

Action	Type of Relief
Deny	Veteran Exemption

Veteran Exemption Tax Relief has been recommended for denial due to the following: application submitted more than one year past the statutory filing deadline. The deadline for submitting a late Veteran Exemption application may be found in Utah Code 59-2-1903. If a claimant feels the County has improperly denied a request for Veteran Exemption tax relief, they may appeal to the Utah State Tax Commission. The appeal must be filed within 30 days after the final action of the county. The appeal should be filed with Council-Tax Administration, who will forward the appeal to the State Tax Commission.
