Dear Honorable County Council Chair Newton:

The Zoo, Arts and Parks (ZAP) Tier II Advisory Board respectfully requests your consideration of their 2018 funding recommendations. During the 2018 funding cycle, the ZAP Tier II program received 185 applications, with requests totaling over \$3.4 million dollars. Of the 185 submissions, 20 were new applicants. The ZAP awards are based on a competitive process and organizations that apply are not guaranteed funding. Two applicants were not recommended for funding because the Tier II Advisory Board determined they did not meet the program requirements for funding or did not demonstrate effective organizational management. The remaining 183 applicants were recommended for Zoo, Arts and Parks Tier II funding totaling \$2,207,800. There have been no appeals. Attached are the ZAP Tier II Advisory Board 2018 recommendations.

If revenues do not meet projections and are less than the total recommended, each awardee (see detail attached) would be decreased a prorated amount. If the funding is more than the recommended amount, the excess funds will first be used for the Local Arts Agency Advancement initiative and then roll over for the 2019 Tier II process.

On behalf of the Tier II Advisory Board, I respectfully request this recommendation be presented before the Salt Lake County Council for its review and ultimate funding decision on Tuesday, August 28th. If you have any questions regarding these recommendations, please do not hesitate to contact me.

Thank you for your continued support of the Zoo, Arts and Parks program.

2018 ZAP APPLICANTS NOT RECOMMENDED FOR FUNDING

ZAP Tier II funding is not guaranteed to any applicant. The ZAP program strives to fund as many arts and cultural applicants as possible. Each funded application has demonstrated that they serve the public through their arts and cultural mission. This year, the ZAP Tier II Advisory Board did not recommend funding to two organizations. The Tier II Advisory Board appreciates the work of these organizations, however, for the reasons listed below, they were deemed not eligible for ZAP Tier II funding.

1. The Leonardo:

The Leonardo was unable to submit a certified financial review or audit as part of the 2018 application, and per ZAP policy, could not be awarded more than \$15,000 for this funding cycle. Taking that into consideration, along with the board's concerns over the organization's financial situation and ongoing viability, the board chose to decline the Leonardo's application for funding.

2. Institute of Classical Architecture:

This organization's identified project in the 2018 application was not eligible for ZAP funding as it did not include a component open to the public, as required by ZAP policy. Although the activities take place within Salt Lake County, the program is run through a private school and is provided only to the students of this institution.
