H.B. 294

 PANDEMIC EMERGENCY POWERS AMENDMENTS
 EFFECTIVE MARCH 24, 2021

Called the "endgame" bill, HB 294 was designed between now and July 1, 2021—to occupy the field for all things COVID-19.

HB 294 has a broad reach and pertains to a state of emergency and any public health orders issued in response or related to "the spread of COVID-19 that the World Health Organization declared a pandemic on March 11, 2020."

HB 294's season is intentionally short.

HB 294 went into effect upon the Governor's signature on March 24, 2021.

The bill sunsets and will be repealed by operation of law on July 1, 2021.

► HB 294 does six, principal things.

(1) WITH THREE EXCEPTIONS, HB 294 TERMINATES ALL COVID-19-RELATED PUBLIC HEALTH ORDERS AND STATES OF EMERGENCY AND RELATED EXECUTIVE ORDERS —WHETHER ISSUED BY THE STATE OF UTAH OR A COUNTY— WHEN THE FOLLOWING THRESHOLD REQUIREMENTS HAVE BEEN MET:

- (a) Utah's 14-day COVID-19 case rate falls below 191 cases per 100,000 residents;
- (b) Utah's 7-day average COVID-19 ICU bed utilization rate falls below 15% or less; and
- (c) Utah's Department of Health provides notice the State of Utah has been allocated 1,633,000 prime doses of a COVID-19 vaccine.



(2) Notwithstanding the termination provision, HB 294 permits a state or local public health order pertaining to public school health and safety restrictions, including the Utah Department of Health's K-12 mask mandate, to remain in place until July 1, 2021.

► (2) Except in K-12 public schools, terminates the Utah Health Department's statewide mask mandate, with two limited alternatives, on April 10, 2021.

(3) As an alternative to the April 10 end to the statewide mask mandate, and subject to the termination conditions set out at no.
(1), above, HB 294 allows a mask order issued by the Utah Department of Health and/or a local heath department to remain in place where the requirement pertains to gatherings of 50 persons or more when 6-foot social distancing among persons in unrelated parties is not possible.

(5) As an additional exception to the April 10 end to the statewide mask mandate, and subject to the termination conditions set out at no. (1), above, HB 294 allows a local health department, with approval of the county legislative body, to issue a public health order requiring the wearing of masks.

► (6) And notwithstanding any of the above, HB 294 expressly permits a state or local public health emergency declaration to remain in effect.
