### 4.1 Canvass of the 2024 Democratic Presidential Primary <u>24-1434</u> Election

Ms. Lannie Chapman, Clerk, reviewed the election results for the 2024 Democratic Presidential Preference Primary. This was an open election, in which all eligible Salt Lake County voters were able to participate. However, only registered Democrats and voters who requested a ballot were mailed In this election, 126,068 voters were issued a ballot by mail. This one. equates to approximately 22 percent of all active Salt Lake County voters. The Clerk's office also provided seven vote centers and one early vote center where voters could opt to cast their vote in person. This election had a lower voter turnout than in 2020 because there was only a Democratic Primary; the Republican Party opted to hold a presidential preference poll at Poll watchers were able to observe in person as its neighborhood caucuses. ballots were processed at the Election Management Center (EMC). The post-election audit was conducted in a publicly noticed meeting. No discrepancies were found during the audit.

In this election, 37,402 voters participated for a 29.67 percent voter turnout. The results were as follows:
