ORGANIZATION OVERVIEW (which could include mission, history, and demographics served):

Utah Youth Village is Utah's oldest and largest charity providing residential and in-home services for troubled children. In Village group and foster homes, young victims of abuse and neglect are nurtured, protected and taught skills to succeed. Through the Village's intensive in-home service, Families First, parents are taught skills to help their struggling child succeed. The Village will serve 460 families this year with Families First and over 120 children in foster and group homes.

The amount you are requesting is 0.01% of your annual agency budget.

What is the purpose of the money you are requesting?:

We are requesting the Mayor's and/or other County officials' presence at our Helping Hand Gala, September 5 from 6-9 at Grand America. We will be honoring A. Scott Anderson, President & CEO of Zion's Bank. Kern Gardner is the Honorary Chair. The amount requested is a table sponsorship, with seating for 10. Individual attendance is also welcome. Tickets are \$150 each. Funds raised at the Helping Hand Gala support Families First, the Village's unique in-home service for families struggling with a troubled child. Families First makes proven, verifiable changes in a troubled home and can prevent a child's removal from the home and placement in foster care, detention, psychiatric hospitalization and other costly, and potentially traumatic placements. Utah Youth Village will serve 460 families through Families First this year, and yet 267 families will remain on the wait list. This can represent a wait of up to two years. Funds raised at the Helping Hand Gala will decrease the wait for some of Utah's most struggling families.

It is further understood that no grant fund will be made available to any County officer of employee or in violation of the requirements of the Public Employees Ethics Act (67-16-1 et seq.). No grant funds will be used for political or campaign purposes. As a further condition of the grant, all County funds may be subject to an audit as required by Salt Lake County. The applicant is required to complete the Disbursement of Funds Report Form for contributions more than \$2,500.

Report on the Financial Statements

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of Utah Youth Village, Inc., which comprise the statement of financial position as of June 30, 2017, and the related statements of activities, functional expenses, and cash flows for the year then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America; this includes the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Auditor's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit. We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgment, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the entity's preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control. Accordingly, we express no such opinion. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial statements.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion.

Opinion

In our opinion, the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of Utah Youth Village, Inc. as of June 30, 2017, and the changes in its net assets and its cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Report on Summarized Comparative Information

We have previously audited Utah Youth Village, Inc.'s 2016 financial statements, and we expressed an unmodified audit opinion on those audited financial statements in our report dated October 6, 2016. In our opinion, the summarized comparative information presented herein as of and for the year ended June 30, 2016 is consistent, in all material respects, with the audited financial statements from which it has been derived.

Dear Sir or Madam:

This letter is in response to your request for a copy of your organization's determination letter. This letter will take the place of the copy you requested.

Our records indicate that a determination letter issued in July 1975, granted your organization exemption from federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. That letter is still in effect.

Based on information subsequently submitted, we classified your organization as one that is not a private foundation within the meaning of section 509(a) of the Code because it is an organization described in sections 509(a)(1) and 170(b)(1)(A)(vi).

This classification was based on the assumption that your organization's operations would continue as stated in the application. If your organization's sources of support, or its character, method of operations, or purposes have changed, please let us know so we can consider the effect of the change on the exempt status and foundation status of your organization.

Your organization is required to file Form 990, Return of Organization Exempt from Income Tax, only if its gross receipts each year are normally more than \$25,000. If a return is required, it must be filed by the 15th day of the fifth month after the end of the organization's annual accounting period. The law imposes a penalty of \$20 a day, up to a maximum of \$10,000, when a return is filed late, unless there is reasonable cause for the delay.

All exempt organizations (unless specifically excluded) are liable for taxes under the Federal Insurance Contributions Act (social security taxes) on remuneration of \$100 or more paid to each employee during a calendar year. Your organization is not liable for the tax imposed under the Federal Unemployment Tax Act (FUTA).

Organizations that are not private foundations are not subject to the excise taxes under Chapter 42 of the Code. However, these organizations are not automatically exempt from other federal excise taxes.

Donors may deduct contributions to your organization as provided in section 170 of the Code. Bequests, legacies, devises, transfers, or gifts to your organization or for its use are deductible for federal estate and gift tax purposes if they meet the applicable provisions of sections 2055, 2106, and 2522 of the Code.

Your organization is not required to file federal income tax returns unless it is subject to the tax on unrelated business income under section 511 of the Code. If your organization is subject to this tax, it must file an income tax return on the Form 990-T, Exempt Organization Business Income Tax Return. In this letter, we are not determining whether any of your organization's present or proposed activities are unrelated trade or business as defined in section 513 of the Code.


The law requires you to make your organization's annual return available for public inspection without charge for three years after the due date of the return. If your organization had a copy of its application for recognition of exemption on July 15, 1987, it is also required to make available for public inspection a copy of the exemption application, any supporting documents and the exemption letter to any individual who requests such documents in person or in writing. You can charge only a reasonable fee for reproduction and actual postage costs for the copied materials. The law does not require you to provide copies of public inspection documents that are widely available, such as by posting them on the Internet (World Wide Web). You may be liable for a penalty of \$20 a day for each day you do not make these documents available for public inspection (up to a maximum of \$10,000 in the case of an annual return).

Because this letter could help resolve any questions about your organization's exempt status and foundation status, you should keep it with the organization's permanent records.

Utah Youth Village has been providing humane and effective treatment to Utah's abused and neglected children for nearly 50 years.





UTAH YOUTH VILLAGE



Utah Youth Village reclaims young lives that have been derailed by abuse and neglect or mental and emotional disorders.

Using the research-based Teaching-Family Model, the Village teaches foster parents in foster homes or biological parents through Families First, the skills they need to give a struggling child nurturing care and consistent structure allowing the child to succeed in school, with peers, on the job and with their family.

The Village offers its unique in-home intervention, Families First, to hundreds of families throughout the state struggling with a child who has mental and emotional disorders. The wait list is 267 families and grows by 10-15 families a month. The families are impoverished and in crisis.

Utah Youth Village owns and operates Alpine Academy a therapeutic boarding school for teenage girls from across the country. It is one of the nation's premier treatment facilities and serves 100 girls and their families a year. It also creates income to support Families First.

The Village is building a second campus to address the wait list for Alpine Academy and the families waiting for Families First.

This Helping Hand Gala is committed to raising significant funds to build a second Alpine Academy campus in order to support struggling Utah families in perpetuity.



TIME FOR THREE Classically Trained String Trio



The groundbreaking, category-shattering trio Time for Three (Tf3) transcends traditional classification, with elements of classical, country western, gypsy and jazz idioms forming a blend all its own. The members—Nicolas (Nick) Kendall, violin; Charles Yang, violin; and Ranaan Meyer, double bass—carry a passion for improvisation, composition, and arrangements, all prime elements of the ensemble's playing.

To date, the group has performed hundreds of engagements as diverse as its music: from featured guest soloists on the Philadelphia Orchestra's subscription series, to Club Yoshi's in San Francisco, to residencies at the Kennedy Center. Recent Highlights include Carnegie Hall, appearances with the Boston Pops, Baltimore Symphony Orchestra, Toronto Symphony Orchestra, Hong Kong Philharmonic, Melbourne and Sydney Symphony Orchestras, sold-out concerts with the Czech Philharmonic and BBC Proms, and an appearance on the ABC prime time hit show "Dancing with the Stars."

In 2014, Time for Three released their debut Universal Music Classics album, Time for Three, which spent seven consecutive weeks at the Top 10 of Billboard's Classical Crossover Chart.

On March 25, 2016, PBS premiered the Emmy-winning show "Time for Three in Concert", a collaboration with the Indianapolis Symphony Orchestra, Universal Music Classics and WFYI Public Media, that brings together diverse artists and unique arrangements to create a one-of-a-kind concert experience.
