

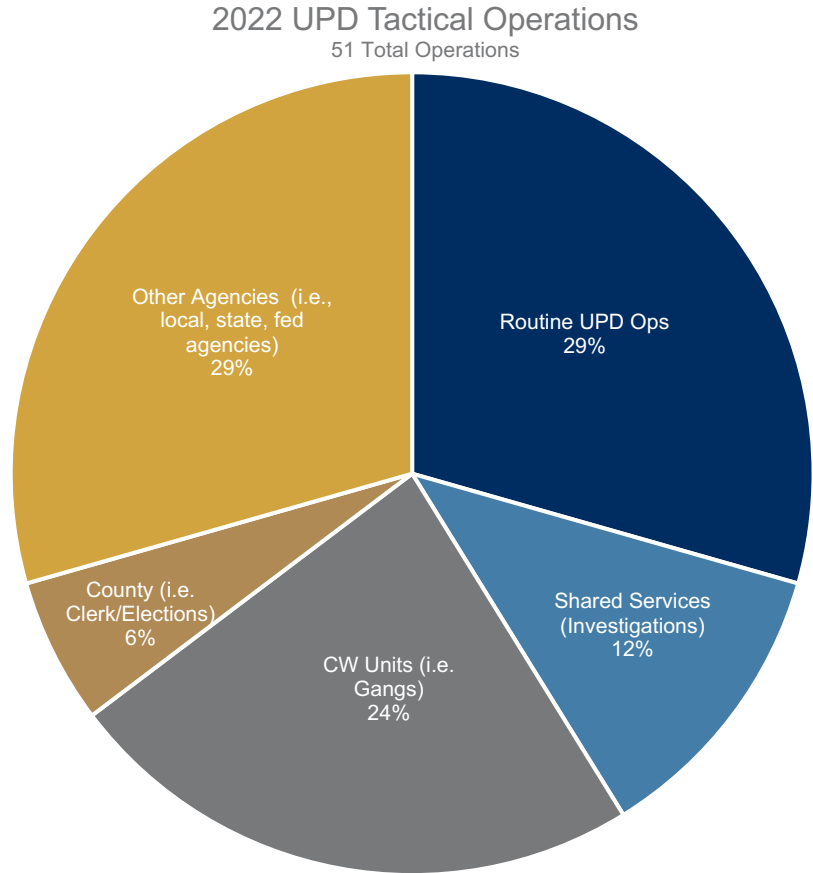

TACTICAL SUPPORT

Funding for 2 FTEs so the Sheriff can fulfill the traditional role of providing tactical support upon request from the County (outside of CW Units/unincorporated) and other non-UPD member communities

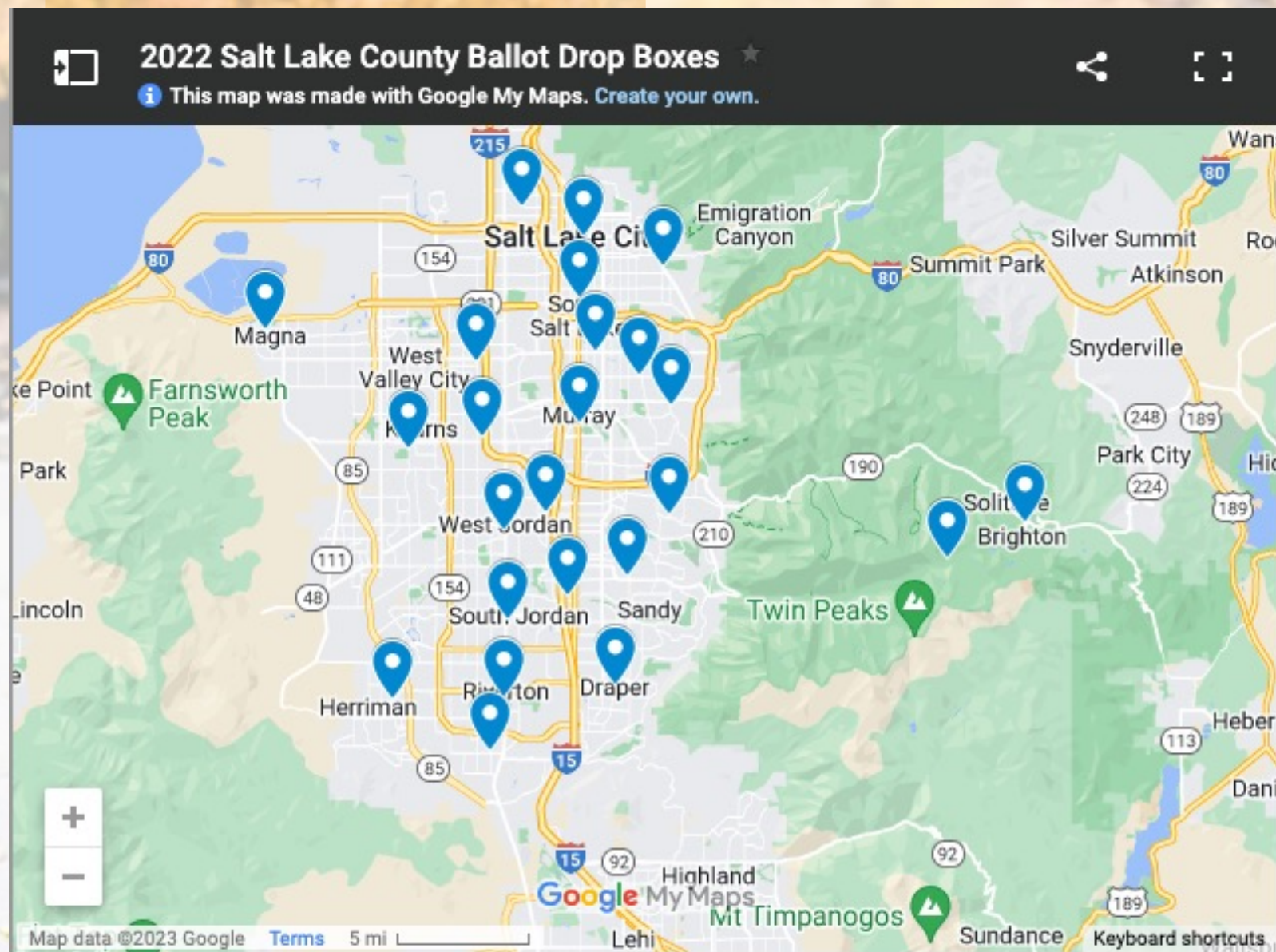


- In 2022 35% of all UPD tactical operations, accounting for more than 780 hours, were performed to satisfy the role of the Sheriff and fall outside of UPD's standard operations.
- Staff: 2 tactical support officers (began July 2021)

Sheriff-Specific Ops Facts:

- 358 hours (12% of all hours) spent on primary and general election ballot collection (18 days each election)
- 166 hours (5.5% of all hours) spent assisting UDC with prisoner movement to the new prison
- 244 hours (8% of all hours) spent providing tactical assistance to municipalities in SLCo





METRO MENTAL HEALTH UNIT

Like Metro Gangs and the DEA Task Force, MHU is a collaborative effort municipalities can be a formal member of, assign staff to, or request assistance with a specific case.

County-Funded Positions:

- 0.7 Sergeant
- 1 Detective
- 1 LCSW (grant funded)

Non-County-Funded Positions (8 total, secondary assignment):

- Cottonwood Heights
- Draper
- Holladay
- Kearns
- Magna
- Millcreek (FT. Det.)
- Sandy
- South Salt Lake

Case Management Timeline

- 1st contact: 5-7 days after police contact. Must be face-to-face.
- 2nd contact: 7-14 days after police contact
- 3rd contact: 14 - 21 days after police contact
- 4th contact: 21- 36 days after police contact

After fourth contact, MHU Sgt. will assess the case:

- Contact monthly
- Contact every 3 months
- Deactivate case

MHU is ideal for violent situations with a person in crisis or where a weapon is present. The co-response model allows for the specially trained officer to de-escalate these situations and make the scene safe so a mental health professional can work with the individual safely.
