Nurse Family Partnership (NFP)

Working Together to Empower First Time Moms



Eligibility

- First-time mom
- Enroll prior to 29 weeks gestation
- ≤ 185% of poverty

Scope

- Delivered by registered nurses
- 2 visits a month
- From pregnancy to 2

Funded

- Intermountain Health Care Primary Promise
- Maternal Infant Childhood Home Visiting Grant

NFP Focus

Improve Pregnancy Outcomes

 Promote healthy behaviors (prenatal care, diet, reduce harmful substances)

Enhance Child Health & Development

Support responsible, competent caregiving

Boost Economic Self-Sufficiency

Foster future planning, education, and job readiness

Parents as Teacher (PAT)

All children will develop, learn, and grow to realize their full potential



Eligibility

- Pregnant women
- Parents with children 3 and under
- Up to ≤ 300% of poverty based on the number of stressors

Scope

- Delivered by parent educators
- 2 visits a month
- From pregnancy to 5
- Monthly group connections

Funded

- Maternal Infant Early Childhood Home Visiting Grant
- Community Based Child Abuse Prevention

PAT Focus

Development-Centered Parenting

- Screenings & Assessments
- Age-related info (safety, sleep, health, nutrition, discipline, transitions, attachment)

Positive Parent-Child Interactions

- Home-based activities
- Focus on developmentally supportive interaction

Family Wellbeing

- Protective factors
- Self-sufficiency resources
- Strengthening relationships & recreation


Nurse Family Partnership Parents as Teachers Outcomes

Evidence-Based Outcomes of Home Visiting Programs

- Reduced substance use during pregnancy
- Decreased child abuse and neglect
- Enhanced family protective factors
- Improved school readiness, performance, and attendance
- Increased child self-regulation skills
- Better child health and development
- Increased economic self-sufficiency & lower government costs

Synapse formation dependent on early experiences




Why Home Visiting is Important
