


UPDES Activities and Compliance



Minimum Control Measures



MCM 1 & 2: Public Information and Outreach

Through the Stormwater Coalition, Salt Lake County:

- Aired over 5000 television commercial spots
- Aired over 2000 Movie trailer spots
- Had over 250,000 return clicks from social media feeds
- Hosted over 2500 4th grade schoolchildren at the Water Quality Fair
- Attended over a dozen community festivals and city fairs
- Installed two stream crossing signs

Minimum Control Measures



MCM 3: IDDE

Salt Lake County Personnel Inspected:

- 38 Outfalls
- 12 Class V Injection Wells

Reported and responded to:

- Over 130 IDDE complaints, 5 of which were determined to be illicit discharges in County/MSD jurisdiction

Minimum Control Measures



MCM 4: Construction Site Stormwater Runoff

Salt Lake County/MSD personnel inspected:

- 40 Construction sites less than 1 acre near a sensitive area
- 29 Construction sites over 1 acre
- Issued 2 Stop Work Orders
- Issued 1 Administrative Order
- Issues 37 Compliance Notices and Orders

Minimum Control Measures



MCM 5: Post-Construction Stormwater Management

Salt Lake County/MSD personnel inspected and reviewed:

- 40 Project Plans, 13 of which have been approved
- 52 stormwater management facilities
- 2 federal enforcement actions were pursued

Minimum Control Measures



MCM 6: Good Housekeeping

All county-owned facilities are inspected for UPDES compliance

- Annually, quarterly or weekly depending on priority of facility
- 4 SWPPP's for high priority facilities
- 1 SPCC Plan underway

Minimum Control Measures



All MCM's: Training and Documentation

All county employees who meet specific criteria are required to complete annual UPDES training.

2018 Training:

Aging and Adult Services: 100%	Flood Control Engineering: 100%	Planning and Development: 100%
Center for the Arts: 100%	Health Department: 100%	PW Operations: 100%
Equestrian Park: 100%	Library Services: 100%	Salt Palace: 100%
Facilities Management: 100%	Mountain America Expo: 100%	Solid Waste: 100%
Fleet Management: 100%	Parks and Recreation: 100%	Youth Services: 100%

UPDES Permit Expiration



Jordan Valley UPDES Permit Expired 10/1/2018

- Old permit has been administratively extended until further notice to address comments received
- New permit will have more strict reporting requirements
- New Permit will have more strict requirements for nutrient removal from stormwater based on "Waste Load Allocations"
- New Permit will have different requirements for onsite stormwater management
- New Permit will require GIS database for all data and reporting requirements
- New Permit requires outreach to specific target audiences: contractors, developers, business owners

Consent Decree Expiration



Consent Decree Updates:

- Final Semi-Annual Report submitted 2/15/2019
- Consent Decree term concludes 4/6/2019
- County will submit a letter requesting the termination of the Consent Decree prior to 4/6/2019
- EPA and DOJ agreed the county has complied with all requests in the Decree to date (October 2018 phone conference)
