



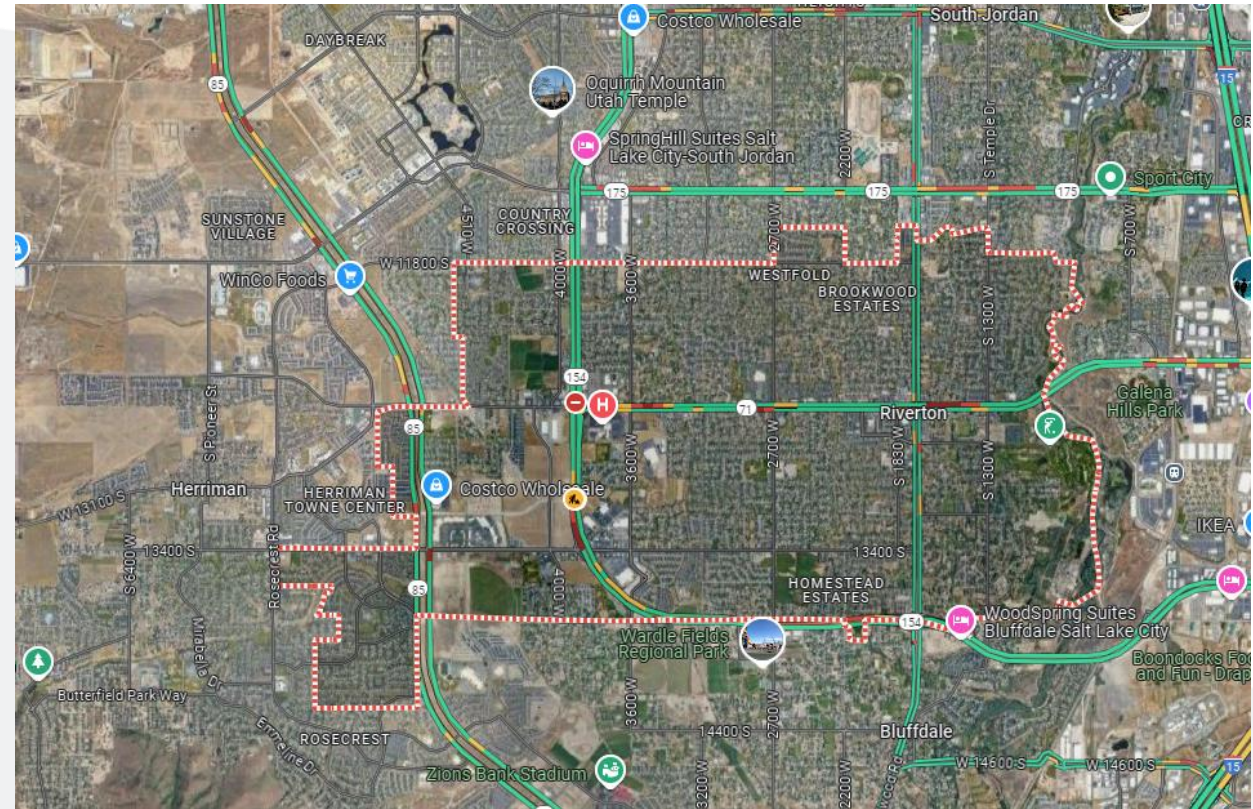

Smith and I am a special education teacher at Riverton. I have been teaching at Riverton Elementary school for the past 10 years. I have a severe special education classroom. My classroom has students with severe disabilities such as Autism, Down Syndrome, and other. My time at the school. I have enjoyed watching my students grow and contribute to the community.

One of the community outings for my students is our walking field trip. We walk from Riverton Elementary to the Riverton Library and then to the playground. This field trip requires a lot of planning and preparation for students with significant cognitive, physical and social delays. Due to these disabilities, I feel strongly that my students should have the opportunity to meet their need for development of their functional and independent living skills. For our walking field trip, we take a lot of time teaching and practicing skills like navigate walking on a street, being kind and courteous to others, identifying objects to themselves, and how to use playground equipment. Our field trip to the library and playground help reinforce these skills in a community setting. One thing I can't replicate in a classroom is the experience of being in a community setting. I am pleased to learn that Riverton City is applying for a grant that will help fund a new playground next to city hall. The very same playground that my students have been going to on our walking field trip each year. As much as we love the playground, it currently resides behind city hall, there are some issues that are difficult for my students to navigate with their physical limitations. The wood chips and lack of adaptive equipment are being the most difficult to work around, especially with my students who use wheelchairs. The playground being proposed for your TRCC grant would eliminate these issues and would give all of my students equal opportunity to access their community to the extent possible.
