

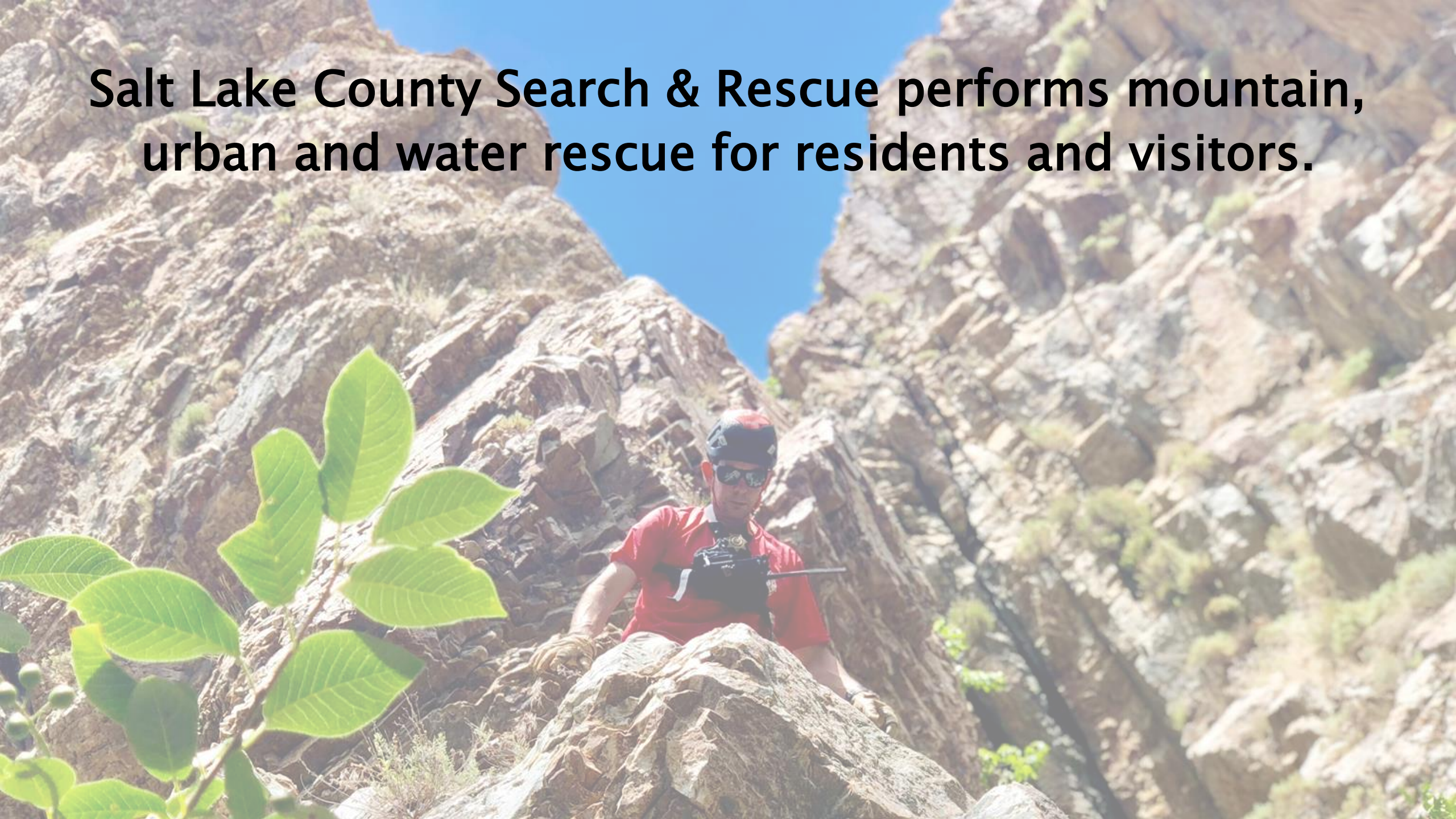

Salt Lake County Search & Rescue performs mountain, urban and water rescue for residents and visitors.



About Our Team

Each of our 40 volunteer members are trained in all facets of rescue allowing us to minimize the cost of resources and training.

Team Member Requirements:

- 9-month training/probation
- 8 hours of training monthly
- Attend 67% of callouts and trainings
- Annual physical tests



Team Member Equipment:

- Communication gear
- Cold weather clothing
- Uniforms
- Additional equipment for performing rescues
- Total Cost: \$7,500/member

Annual Training

Each member must pass these tests annually:

- **Pack Test:** 1.7 mile hike in less than 50 minutes with 20–pound pack, 1,500–foot elevation gain on Mt. Olympus
- **Swim Test:**
 - 100 yards no PFD
 - 50 yards with PFD
 - 50 yards tow victim with PFD
 - 2 minute tread water with hands over head
 - Retrieve object from bottom of pool
- **RROC1 Test (must get 100%):**
 - Knots
 - Anchors
 - Load Factors
 - Rope Systems
- Must maintain **medical certification** (minimum of Wilderness First Responders)

Supplemental Training

On average we bring on 10 new team members each year, after 9 months of training only 2-4 will graduate.

During a team member's first year they will complete:

- Basic Rock Rescue: Hosted by us for the State of Utah with students from across the country
- Advanced Rock Rescue: Held in Moab every Fall

During a team member's second year they may attend:

- Avalanche Training Level 1
- Swiftwater Rescue Technician Course
- Scuba courses

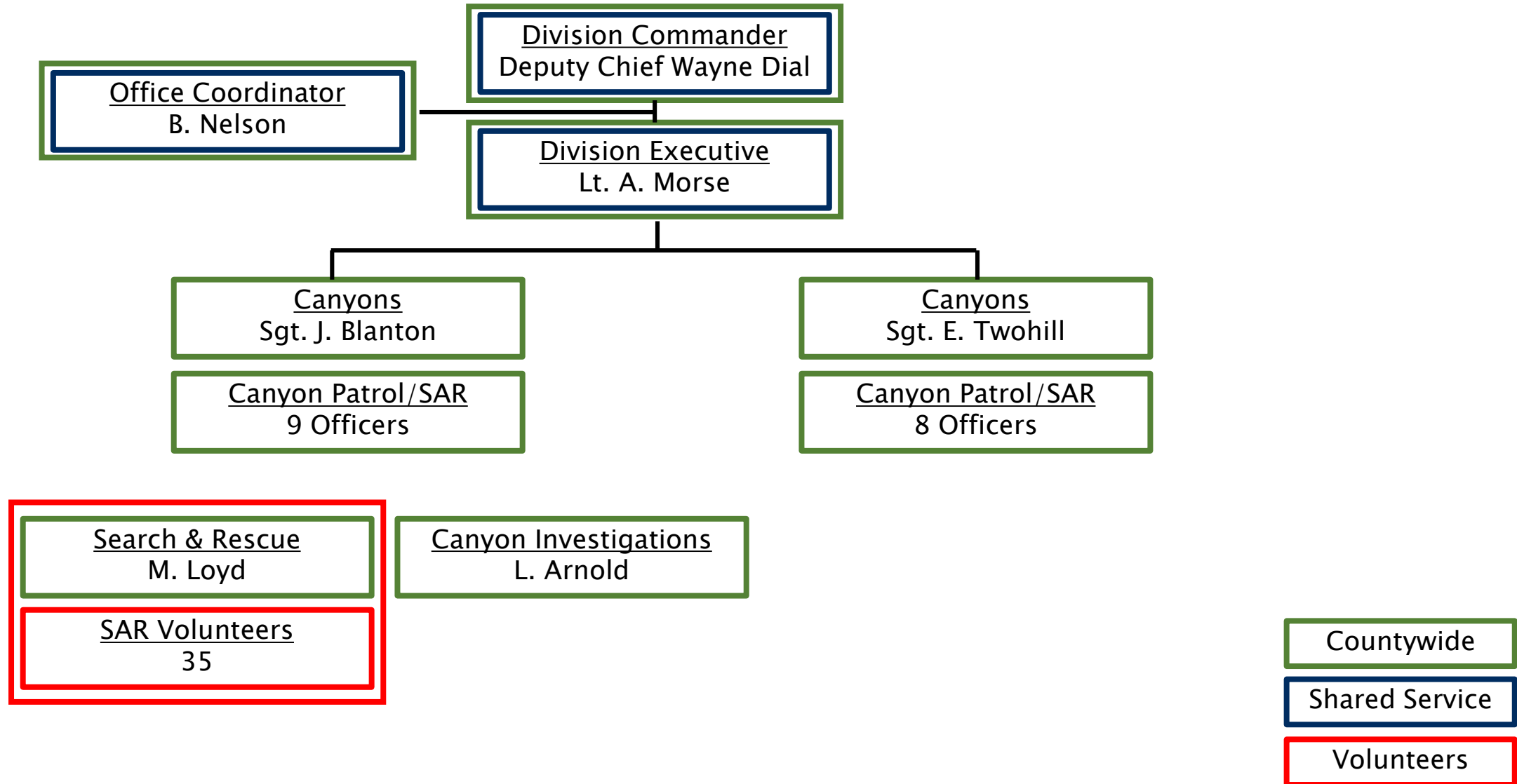
