## Sheriff's Compensation Request

### Sworn Compensation

- Sworn Market Adjustment:
  - Correction Line Deputy II Move to a grade 17 while maintaining current step. (5.58% increase)
  - Correction Deputy II Rank Each rank will move up one grade while maintaining current step. (2.75% increase)
  - Public Safety Line Deputy I Move to a grade 13 while maintaining current step. (5.58% increase) (collapsing career ladder will give 11 deputies a larger increase)
  - Public Safety Deputy I Sergeant Move starting step from step 5 to step 7
- Sworn Merit Increase
  - All Sworn Correction Deputy II and Public Safety Deputy I (including Rank) that are eligible receive a 2.75% merit step increase on merit date.
  - 1% Longevity payment for all Sworn Correction Deputy II and Public Safety Deputy I (including Rank) that are at the top of the range.
- Civilian Environmental Pay
  - \$ requested based on giving \$0.50 per hour for those eligible.



## Salt Lake County Jail Capacity

 New Resolution Setting Forth the Maximum Operational Capacity

#### A RESOLUTION SETTING FORTH MAXIMUM OPERATIONAL CAPACITY FOR THE SALT LAKE COUNTY JAIL

WHEREAS, Salt Lake County Ordinances, 2001 Chapter 1.08.030 and Utah Code Annotated, Section 17-22-5.5 authorizes the Sheriff to establish a maximum operating capacity of each jail facility with the approval of the County legislative body; and

WHEREAS, the Sheriff currently operates the County's Jail Facility which consists of the Salt Lake County Adult Detention Center and Oxbow Jail; and

WHEREAS, County Ordinance requires the maximum operating capacity to be set, at least annually, as part of the County budget process; and

WHEREAS, Utah Code provides that with the approval of the County Council the Sheriff shall set a maximum operating capacity for each jail facility based on the facility design and staffing;

WHEREAS, Utah Code Annotated Section 17-22-5 authorizes the Sheriff to implement written policies for admission of prisoners and classification of incarcerated person in the jail for the safety and well-being of the prisoners and the community prior to and in conjunction with the maximum operating eapacity.

#### RESOLUTION

NOW, THEREFORE the County Council of Salt Lake County resolves that under the current design and staffing, the maximum operational capacity of the Salt Lake County Jail Facility is Two Thousand Fifty (2,050). The maximum operating capacity may be temporarily reduced by the number of unavailable beds when a unit is closed for repairs, due to staffing or other administrative necessities. Upon reaching the maximum operating capacity, the Sheriff shall take appropriate measures allowed by law.

Further, when the prisoner population reaches 80% of the maximum operating capacity the Sheriff shall apply the uniform written policies for admission of prisoners as allowed by law for the safety and well-being of immates and the community.

By ordinance, the Salt Lake County Council annually adopts a Limitation of Jalt Capacity. In 2018, the County Council set a limitation on jail capacity establishing a maximum jail operational capacity of 2165 prisoners and a rated capacity of 2455 prisoners. Based upon this limitation, the Corrections Bureau Chief Deputy is authorized to implement the following Jail Uniform Admissions Plan:

#### Pre-implementation options (Conditions):

 Review pre-file list, time-served report, and outside agency transportation list to gauge how many prisoners may be released that day due to charges not being filed in the mandated amount of time, time-served releases, and custody-charges with other agencies.

- Encourage expanded pretrial releases.
- Expand use of electronic monitoring.

 Accept and hold out-of-county warrants for 24 hours maximum for offenses that would be eligible for overcrowding release per this Uniform Admissions Policy. Acceptance occurs only after confirmation from the issuing County that picking will occur within the 24-hour period.

Pursuant to U.C.A. §17-22-5.5(2)(b)(ii) and the Salt Lake County Council establishment of a maximum jail capacity, the sheriff establishes a uniform admissions goldcy. The Corrections Bureau Chief Deputy will implement this policy on a graduated basis when the secured jail population reaches 80% of the operational capacity received for admission. Initially, the steps in Phase One of the policy will be used to reduce the jail's population. During the implementation of this plan, the Corrections Bureau Chief Deputy shall continue to coordinate current jail programs, the booking process, pretrial release, any alternative release programs, and the association of sood time credits pursuant to results risk policy.
