I began my career as a journalist in 1968 as a reporter for WBOC Television in Salisbury, MD., then worked for the Beachcomber and Delmarva News, sister newspapers based in Selbyville, DE, in 1969-71; finally, I joined the Deseret News in 1971 and worked there until my retirement in 2008. For the last couple of decades at the Deseret News I was the science reporter, and much of my coverage was about space news and discoveries. With my retirement, I continued writing about space for the paper in column form for several years. I served as vice president of the Salt Lake Astronomical Society. Besides the Facebook postings, we have monthly meetings in the University of Utah South Physics Building, just below the rooftop observatory. We have only a few who show up to these meetings, generally about a dozen, although sometimes there are many more. Usually the sessions are streamed live.

I have continued my astronomy writing in a blog, which is available on the internet at this point, <u>Home (the-nightly-news.com)</u>; simply click on the word "Blog" at the top and they will show up. My latest completed essay, from December, is at <u>Blog 146: Why do we care? (the-nightly-news.com)</u> and is a summary of my feelings about astronomy. I expect my newest one will be finished and posted soon.
