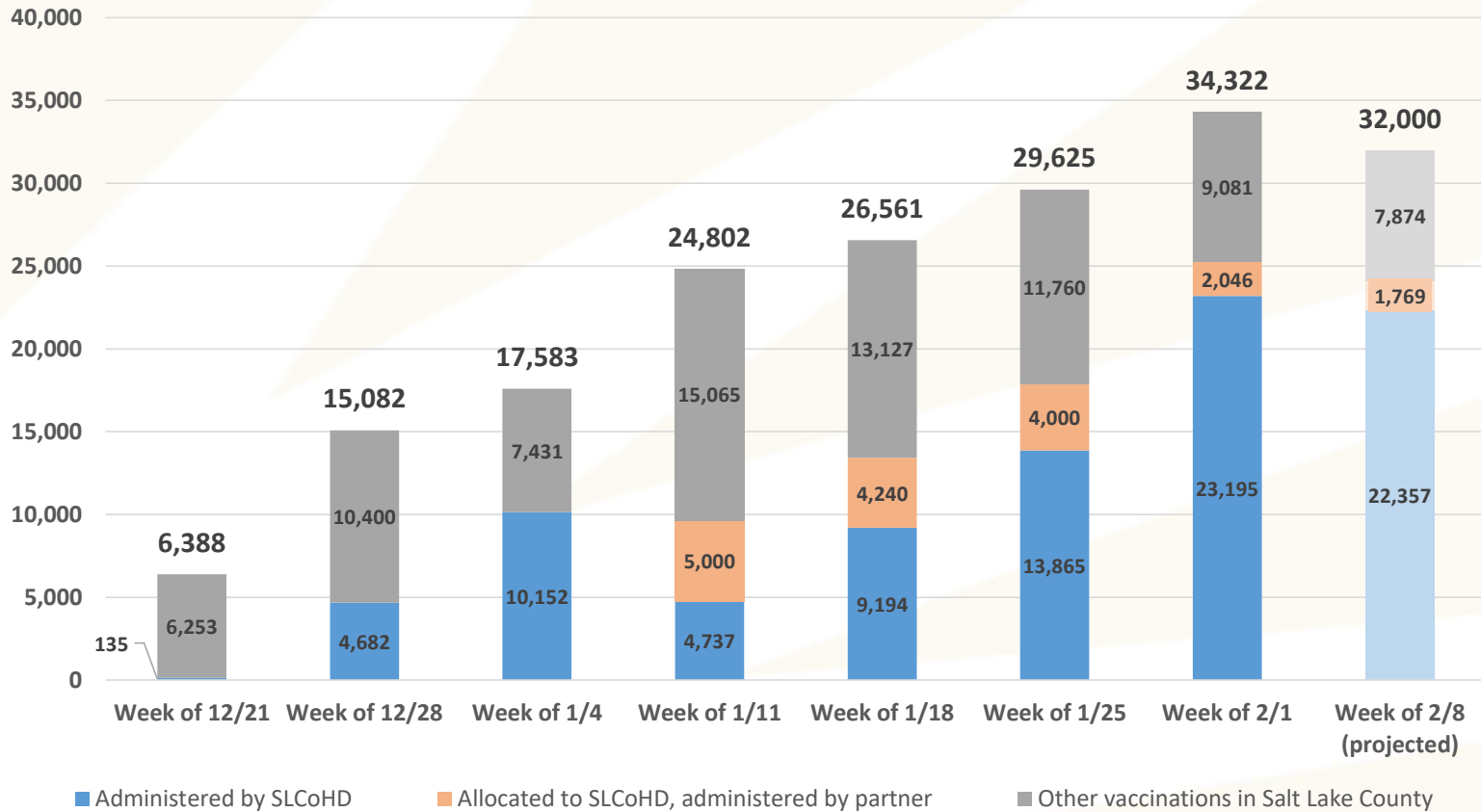

Vaccine Dose Projections

- February – 23,000 weekly
 - Starting this week, pharmacies will receive their own allocation
 - Starting next week, SLCoHD will be reallocating doses to support pharmacies and community partners
- March – 45,000 weekly
- Mid-April – 70,000 weekly
