Survivor and Victim Services: help victims navigate the criminal justice process through education, court accompaniment

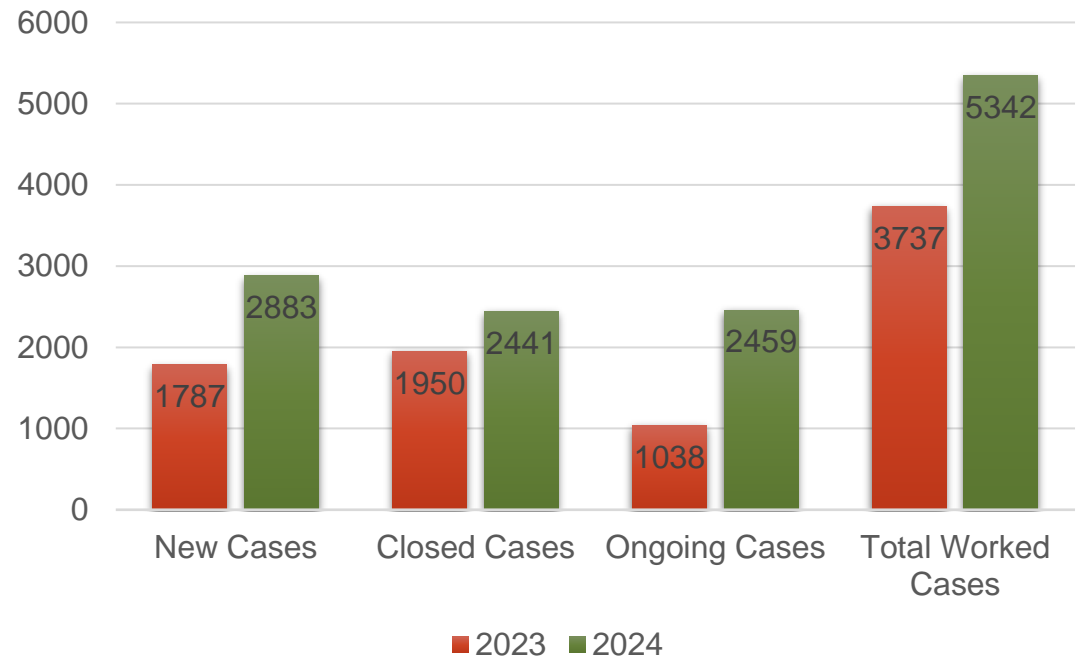


Survivor and Victim Services Program

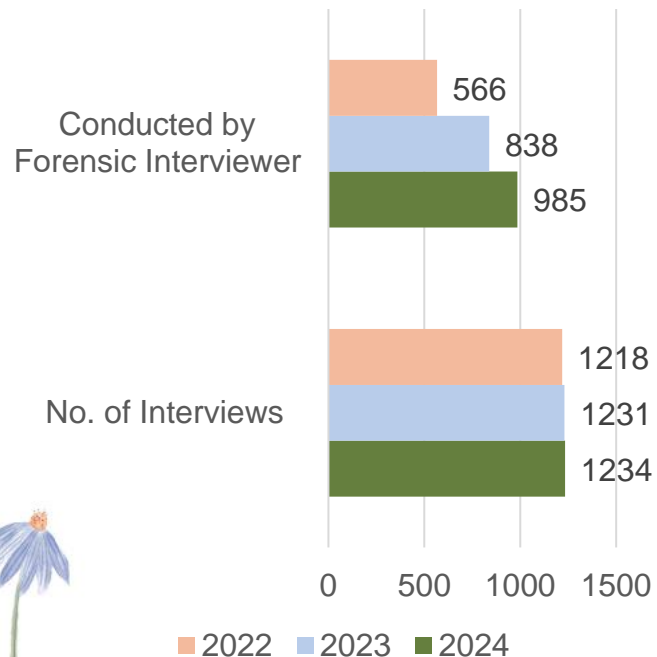
- **2024 Total cases: 5342**

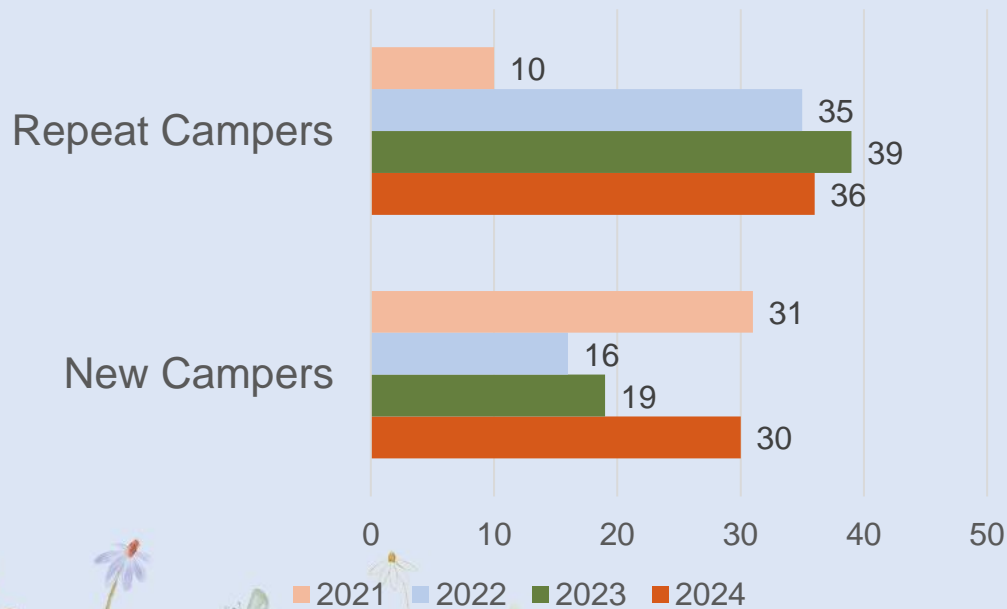
