



- Gangs are becoming more organized
- Expanding statewide
- Juvenile involvement is increasing
- Primary funding source for gangs are drugs and criminal activity, including robbery, theft, and other violent crime
- Firearm related offenses are increasing

DRUG & GUN SEIZURE DATA (2019-2023)


- 35,022 fentanyl pills in 2023 alone
- 58,752 prescription pills
- 339 pounds of methamphetamine
- 19 pounds of cocaine
- 23 pounds of heroin
- 177 pounds of marijuana
- 606 firearms





NIBIN & CGIC – DPS STATEWIDE PARTNER

NIBIN: NATIONAL INTEGRATED BALLISTIC INFORMATION NETWORK | CGIC: CRIME GUN INFORMATION CENTER



- MGU operates the CGIC in partnership with DPS
 - Found substantial overlap in gun investigations with gangs
- NIBIN is an investigative tool that catalogues shell casing
 - Every firearm leaves a "fingerprint" on a shell casing
 - When casings are recovered from a crime, (i.e., drive-by) they are run through NIBIN
 - This helps investigators connect cases and solve crimes

CHOOSE GANG FREE – PREVENTION & INTERVENTION

- 5th & 8th grade curriculum in high demand
 - Reviewing 2nd grade curriculum
- Canyons & Granite Districts currently use curriculum
 - Jordan & Ogden Districts will add the curriculum 24/25 school year
- Strong partnership with JJYS working with gang-involved youth in-custody
- New partnership with Utah Department of Corrections
