#### 4.1. County Council Members

Council Member Harrison stated she was able to take a tour of the Kem and Carolyn Gardner Mental Health Crisis Care Center, which will be an important resource in the community.

Council Member Theodore stated she received an email inviting the Council to attend the annual Wreaths Across America event at the Fort Douglas Cemetery on

Saturday, December 14, 2024, at 10:00 AM.

**Council Member Stringham** stated there were many elected officials in the District of Columbia who were attending to see the unveiling of the Dr. Martha Hughes Cannon, the first female state senator in U.S. history, at the National Statuary Hall. The unveiling would take place on December 11, 2024. Dr. Cannon created the first Health Department in Utah.

#### 4.2. County Mayor

Mayor Wilson delivered her monthly report.

- The Salt Lake County Animal Services Division had a very successful Giving Tuesday, where it raised over \$17,000 for its Injured Animal Fund.
- The Salt Lake County Parks and Recreation Division hosted more than 250 people for a community Thanksgiving dinner at the Central City Recreation Center. The meal was prepared by staff from Utah Valley University's Culinary Arts Institute, and served by the recreation center staff.
- The Magna Recreation Center will be hosting "Santa Stacks" on December 23, 2024, from 9:00 AM through 11:00 AM. Members of the community can enjoy free hotcakes, drinks, and games.
- The Office of Regional Development's Ebus map is up and running, which will allow viewers to see real-time data of non-polluting buses moving throughout the County. The County is partnering on the air quality monitoring project to help policy makers better understand if there are sections of the valley more susceptible to bad air than others.
- The Mayor commended the Office of Regional Development team for its ongoing work on the Millcreek Canyon Federal Lands Access Program (FLAP) grant project.
- The Utah Department of Transportation (UDOT) is conducting a study on traffic congestion in Big Cottonwood Canyon. It is in the public comment stage. The Mayor stated she would continue to promote common-sense solutions.
