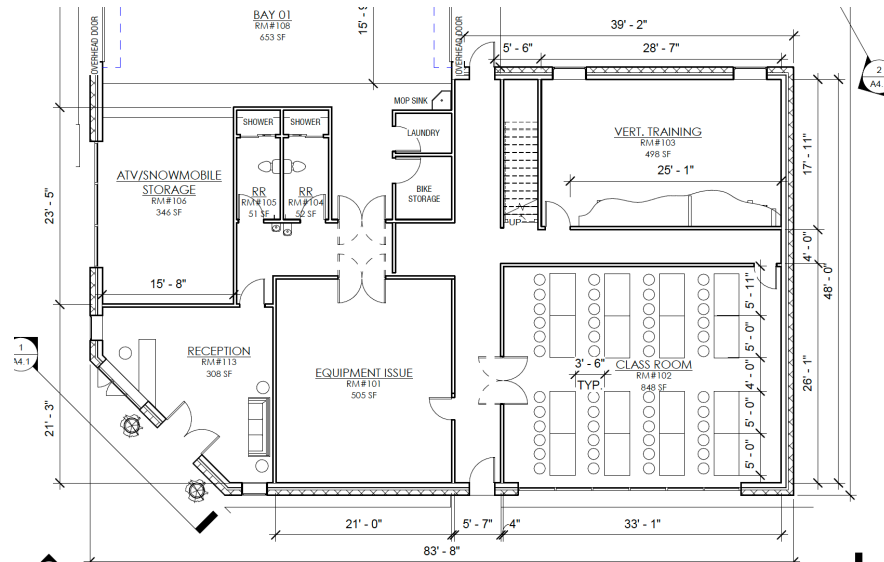
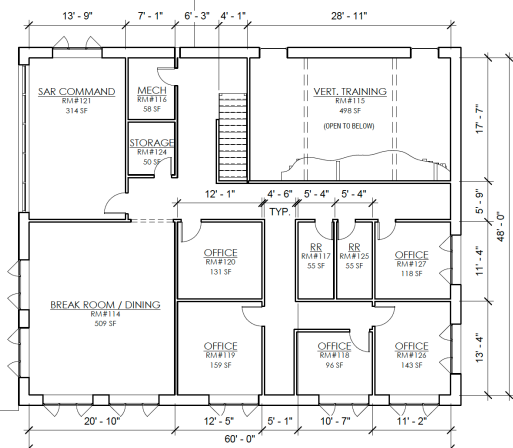
CURRENT SAR FACILITY

- 1960's fire station retrofitted as temporary SAR HQ in early 2000s
- 2,493 sqft
- 1 bathroom
- 5 parking spots
- Trailer, snowmobiles, ATVs, and other equipment stored off-site
- Unable to accommodate onsite training



FUTURE FACILITY NEEDS

- Space for centralized equipment storage
- 5 pull through garages
- Parking for 40+ team members
- Classroom and indoor training space
- 3 bathrooms with locker room
- Kitchen
