#### Dear Honorable Mayor Wilson:

The Zoo, Arts and Parks Tier I + Zoological Advisory Board has completed its annual review process and respectfully requests your consideration of their 2023 funding recommendations be submitted to the Salt Lake County Council for final approval.

Twenty-three (23) organizations applied for Tier I funding and three organizations applied for Zoological funding. Per state statute, the Tier I category is limited to fund twenty-two (22) organizations and the Zoological category is limited to fund three organizations (3). All applications have been reviewed and twenty-five (25) are being recommended for Zoo, Arts and Parks Tier I and Zoological funding.

Funding allocations are based on state statute. The Tier I category is distributed by percentage of the organization's three-year average of qualifying expenditures. The Zoological category is allocated by fixed percentages per Utah State Statute.

Thank you for your consideration of this request and for your continued support of the Zoo, Arts and Parks program.
