




OFF-LEASH DOG PARK IMPLEMENTATION PLAN

Salt Lake County

PROJECT PURPOSE

Identify 2-3 sites for regional dog parks and prepare conceptual master plans for each site.

BUILDING UPON 2008 OFF-LEASH DOG PARK MASTER PLAN



Dog Park Master Plan SITE-SELECTION CRITERIA:

1. Proximity to other dog parks
2. Adjacent land use compatibility
3. Environmental considerations
4. Vehicular and pedestrian access
5. Visibility
6. Site infrastructure
7. Dog park distribution
8. Dog park location recommendations

Project uses same site-selection criteria to identify and prioritize sites (refer to selection matrix)

In 2012 the County proposed temporary off-leash areas in 11 parks across the county. This proposal was met with widespread opposition. The current project addresses many of the concerns raised.

PROJECT GOALS

GOAL 1: Identify sites large enough to accommodate a **regional dog park** (5-10 acres), while minimizing development costs

GOAL 2: Prioritize sites **clearly visible** to the public

GOAL 3: Identify sites **adjacent to compatible land uses**

GOAL 4: Prioritize sites with **existing infrastructure** such as parking and utilities

GOAL 5: Prioritize sites **evenly distributed** across the county and adjacent to existing parks/open space, while not overlapping service areas of other regional dog parks

GOAL 6: Prioritize **ease of vehicular and pedestrian access** to site


GOAL 7: **Avoid impacts to environmentally sensitive resources**

GOAL 8: Prioritize sites with **public support** and minimal public concern or opposition




INPUT FROM THE PUBLIC

Parks and Rec staff along with the Off-Leash Stakeholder Committee recommend proceeding with concept plans and preliminary budgets for the following sites:

- Magna Regional Park
- Wardle Fields Regional Park
- Lodestone Regional Park

There is currently funds in the contract to complete these concept plans.

There have not been any funds appropriated for construction.

These concept plans will be presented to the public in the last round of public meetings.

Magna Regional Park



Summary:

Magna Regional recently finished the master planning process, and Phase I is scheduled for completion in 2020. Current plans for an off-leash park include a temporary park located in the undeveloped area included in Phase II. Long term plans would require purchasing the property south of the current park and placing a permanent off-leash facility there. This would provide needed separation from other uses in the park.

Estimated Cost*: \$650,000

Summary:

Phase I of Wardle Fields Regional Park is completed and future phases remain undeveloped. The current plan for off-leash facilities would place a facility at the northwest corner of the park. This would address the concerns of ensuring that the off-leash facility was separated from the existing splash pad.

Estimated Cost*: \$500,000


