



ZAP Parks & Recreation Bond History

- In 1996, 2006 & 2016 the SLCo Council placed on the election ballot a request for voters to approve a 10-year General Obligation (G.O.) bond
- The bond proceeds were used to fund ZAP related recreational facilities throughout the County.
- 17 Member Review Board
- Separate from the ZAP statute which funds operations




ZAP BOND I - 1996


ZAP BOND III - 2016



Welcome to the Springview Farms Migratory Wildlife Bird Refuge

This land, approximately seven acres, has been dedicated as a refuge for the preservation of the many birds and wildlife that frequent this area.

In 2018 this property was donated to the Springview Farms Homeowners Association. In concert with the Jordan River Commission and funding from the Jordan River Foundation, this sign was made possible to memorialize the park and the individuals who spent their time, money, and resources to make it possible.

Canadian geese, various species of ducks, cranes, ibis, and numerous raptors can be seen here almost daily. The original property owners, the Loumie family, along with the project developers, wanted to see this property preserved as a refuge. With that in mind, the Springview Farms master plan designated this seven-acre corridor as a refuge where native migratory and other birds could have a place to raise their young and rest from their flights, free from human intervention. A conservation easement was recorded on the property with specific instructions that the easement should be maintained in perpetuity. In this protected area, you can enjoy the birds and observe the young goslings and ducklings as they grow and thrive in the natural spring setting.


