
Factor Analysis - Example



Factor Analysis - Example




Process for Developing Action Plans







SUSTAINABILITY

How do we *multiply* dollars?

Utah State Board of Education- Quality Improvement Grant
\$500,000 ~ for 5 years of funding towards afterschool programming at Millcreek Elementary. \$75,000 need to fund last 2 years.

HUD/ SL County Community Development- Community Development Block Grant
\$150,000 for 1 year of funding towards Sunnyvale, matched by \$150,000 from Millcreek.

- 1 “unskilled” volunteer hour = \$16-\$22
- 1 “skilled” executive volunteer hour= \$35-\$50

Millcreek City Council- Millcreek Promise Funding
\$200,000 for 2 years of funding towards staff, grant writing, grant management, executive board management, volunteer management, growing partnerships, promoting & marketing, supplementing programming, and training.
