Women, Infants and Children (WIC)

- **Serves:**

- Pregnant women, new mothers and children under age 5
- Households under 185% of poverty
 - For a family of 4 that would be \$49,025 per year

- **Provides:**

- Nutritious foods (whole grains, dairy, cheese, eggs, fresh vegetables and fruits, beans, juice, peanut butter, baby formula, special formula)
- Nutrition education
- Breastfeeding support
- Referrals to health care and other community resources





- During the last year Utah WIC successfully transitioned from benefits issued on paper vouchers to electronic benefits administered via a smart card and added fresh/frozen fruits and vegetables to the food package
- Utah WIC ranks #7 in the Nation for the percentage of postpartum women breastfeeding during any given month (40.9%)

Infectious Disease

Serves:

- All Salt Lake County residents
 - Majority are refugees, immigrants, homeless, and individuals with substance use disorders

Provides:

- Treatment, education, support and links to care for:
 - Latent and Active TB
 - Hepatitis B and C
 - Hansen's disease (leprosy)
 - Crutchfield Jakob's Disease (CJD)
- Community education and certification for TB skin testing



Sexually Transmitted Disease (STD) Clinic

Serves:

- All Salt Lake County residents
- Low income, uninsured, and those with no medical providers

Offers:

- Testing and treatment for various types of STD's
- HIV rapid tests (results in 20 minutes) and HIV blood tests
- PrEP HIV prevention

Home Visiting

Serves:

- Pregnant women and children up to age 5
- Medicaid eligible or at or below 185% of poverty

Offers:

- Two evidence-based programs
 - Nurse-Family Partnership
 - Parents as Teachers
- Medicaid Early Childhood Target Case Management

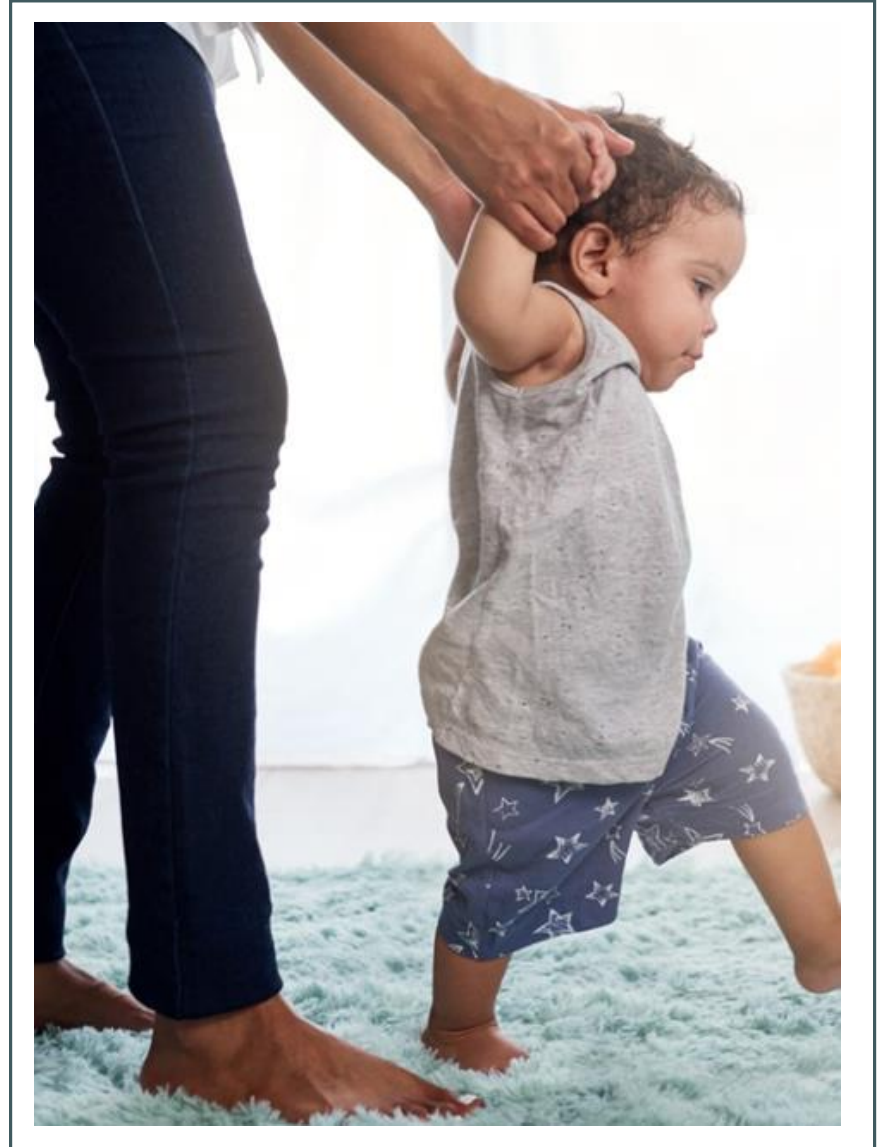
Provides:

- Education regarding healthy pregnancy, child development, positive parent child interactions and family well being
- Links families to needed resources to improve self sufficiency and engagement in their communities



Evidence-Based Home Visiting

- Decreases substance use during pregnancy
- Decreases child abuse and neglect
- Improves school readiness with better performance, lower rates of absenteeism and suspensions
- Increases a child's self-regulation skills
- Improves child health and development
- Increases economic self-sufficiency and reduced government costs with a return on investment of over \$6 per dollar spent





Home Visiting

- Expanding Nurse-Family Partnership with funding from Intermountain Healthcare
- Exploring additional funding to expand Nurse-Family Partnership with Sorensen Impact Center and Salt Lake City
- Numerous successes for evidence-based home visiting:
 - 15-year-old high school drop out to college graduate
 - Home ownership
 - Improved maternal mental health

Immunizations

Serves:

- All Salt Lake County residents

Offers:

- Childhood, adult, and travel vaccinations
- Participates in Vaccine for Children program to offset vaccine cost for those who are uninsured or on Medicaid
- Special projects vaccines- Hepatitis A or B, flu, pneumonia, or Tdap (diphtheria/pertussis) free to vulnerable populations



Immunizations



Outreach Clinics

- Provided in partnership with community-based organizations in areas of high social vulnerability and at-risk for poor health outcomes

International Travel

- Tailored education and vaccinations to mitigate travel risks

Outbreak Response

- Collaboration with other SLCoHD Divisions
- Vaccination is a key public health intervention used to control vaccine preventable disease outbreaks

Immunization Initiative

- Collaborates with WIC to assess WIC participants immunization status, provide vaccine education, and assist with obtaining needed vaccines
