Re: Clark Planetarium Advisory Board Appointments

Clark Planetarium's Advisory Board currently has 6 vacancies. We received 12 applications for consideration. A nominating committee made up of board leadership and the Division Director conducted personal interviews with 11 candidates, one candidate declined to interview, and all 11 candidates met a high standard of professional qualifications and would make strong members of the board. However, to maximize board effectiveness and outreach potential, we also used the criteria below to prioritize the candidates.

Increased Diversity and Gender Equality: Increasing diverse representation is a top strategic goal for this board. The board is currently made up of 4 women and 7 men. Four of the top 5 ranked candidates are female, which if selected, would move women to a majority position on the board. The candidates presented also represent an increase in cultural and ethnic representation, creating more connections in the community for the Planetarium to cultivate stronger relationships and co-create STEM experiences that better serve our diverse populations.

Related Industries: To ensure that Clark Planetarium has access to industry expertise beyond its staff and to engage stakeholders that are invested in the fulfillment of our mission, the nominating committee targeted aerospace, technology, science, and education – both K-12 and higher education.

Community Relationships: Building and maintaining strong relationships within the community is vital to Clark Planetarium's long-term growth and stability. Candidates with wide networks will help the planetarium grow its circle of support.

Geographic Representation: As a division of Salt Lake County it is important that there is representation from all six council districts and the nominating committee is pleased to note that our applicants increase our current representation from Districts 1 and 4 to include Districts 2, 3 and 5.
