University Neighborhood Partners (UNP) is a department of the University of Utah that seeks to combine university resources and resources from the west side communities of Salt Lake City for reciprocal learning, action, and benefit. UNP accomplishes this by bringing together university departments, community residents and non-profit partners to collaboratively host programs addressing access to higher education and other complex systems; employment preparation, placement and training; health education; after-school programming for youth; social justice and healthy relationships; and other issues. This model of working with residents and community organizations rather than becoming another service provider increases the capacity of local non-profits to deliver services to more clients, increases their effectiveness by connecting service delivery with academic research, engages residents in issues affecting their communities, and strengthens the academic experience of both students and faculty at the university by connecting study with practice. While the university provides salary support for staff, programming support is all privately supported through fundraising efforts.

Partners in the Park is a five-week summer program designed to bring together the residents of Salt Lake City's west side and partners from the University of Utah through shared interests and activities. The program connects potential students and their families with higher education, raising their awareness about and access to the lifelong value of higher education. Held on Tuesdays throughout the summer, the program draws upwards of two thousand community residents and University members. Activities include college preparation materials from Student Recruitment & High School Services, mentoring from university student-athletes, health checkups with health care providers, and other recreational activities such as games, races, raffles, gardening activities, bingo, and many more. Dinner is also served to attendees at every event.

University Neighborhood Partners utilizes this family-friendly, community venue to encourage west side parents to see higher education as a real possibility for their families. During the event, volunteers distribute materials in English and Spanish with age-appropriate messages about how to prepare for college. Through this and other strategies, *Partners in the Park* creates a community-wide environment to increase the possibility that children from these neighborhoods will continue their education beyond high school. Our goal is that the children in west side schools will complete college and return to these neighborhoods as bi-lingual teachers, counselors, pharmacists, engineers, and parents to build an ever-healthier community for all of us.

At the kick-off event on June 14, 2017, scholarships will be awarded to current or past residents of west Salt Lake City who are high school seniors, have earned a GED, are freshmen undergraduate students and/or students transferring from community college to a four-year institution in pursuit of a bachelors degree, and who have been involved with UNP partnerships and/or volunteer with UNP or other west side community partners.




