


Over the past 15 years our Parks have gone from manual hand watering to a fully digital real time weather based technology system. (30% water waste reduction).






Cultural Core Plan won an Achievement Award from the American Planning Association Utah Chapter, the highest honor to be bestowed upon a planning project.








Summer Kids Passport Program
