



Kearns Athletic Training and Events Center

Investment: \$11 Million+

Through partnership with the Oval, KOPFC and others, this center will increase access to physical health services, meeting place for the community, and increase the tax base.

Financial Health Seminars

Various organizations in partnership with Salt Lake County are providing seminars to educate and develop family financial plans.

Wasatch Front Regional Council Grant A grant to support strategies to meet economic development goals.

and = 1 biking mile **Bike Lanes** Biking infrastructure provides physical health opportunities & increases safety. 8 biking miles are currently completed & 4 additional miles are expected to be installed this year.

Camp Kearns Road Infrastructure The last remaining section of the original Camp Kearns is one of the most under-utilized industrial development areas in the County. Roads to be completed by Fall of 2017.

Oquirrh Park Area Masterplan

Partnership between the Kearns community, Salt Lake County Parks and Recreation, the Oval, and Kearns Oquirrh Park Fitness Center to meet long term planning of economic development.



Kearns Library

The Kearns Library is the heart of the Kearns community. It also happenes to be the oldest and most used library. Construction is scheduled to begin in 2018.

Investment: \$3 Million + building cost

Intergenerational Poverty (IGP)

Next Generations Kids is a two-year pilot, led by Department of Workforce Serivces, that takes a new approach to break the intergenerational cycle of poverty. There are 19 families served in Kearns.

Investment: 19 Families served in Kearns




SHARP Data Analysis: Priorities

- Proven to address priorities: alcohol use, depression, and poor family management






Positive Family Supports

- Will serve families in Kearns Jr.
- Proven to address priorities: alcohol use, nicotine use, depression, poor family management, and low commitment to school



Drug Free Communities Grant



- Goal: Reduce youth substance abuse (alcohol, nicotine)
- Community Collaboration & Environmental Strategies
- Federal 5-year grant, \$125k / year

Community Needs Assessment

Understand the changing needs of the community to guide strategy and service implementation.

Lighthouse Research & Development is a local market research company with experience researching the needs of older adults and caregivers. Assessment includes both qualitative & quantitative data.

- Focus Groups (6 total)
- In-depth Interviews (12 total)
- Telephone Survey (300 total responses)





Youth Services Providing Safety, Shelter and Support

Shelter Care

Contract with Division of Child and Family Services to provide shelter services renewed.

HB 239 Juvenile Justice Reform – Schools may not refer youth to law enforcement or juvenile court for truancy or school-based status offense, infractions, or class C misdemeanors. Most changes took effect August 1, 2017.

Loss of \$194.7k federal grant for Milestone Transitional Living Program to address homelessness by helping young adults become self-sufficient through access to safe housing, stable employment and connections to ongoing support and resources.

Why Home Visiting

Home Visiting Benefits

- Healthier moms and babies
- Children better prepared for school
- Children are safer
- Families are more self-sufficient
- Reduced societal cost





Home Visiting Programs

- Nurse Family Partnership (NFP)
- Parents as Teachers



Health Department Home Visiting Programs

Impact

Pre-Term Births < 37 Weeks:

- The odds of pre-term birth was 53% lower for Nurse Family Partnership (NFP) participants
- The odds of pre-term birth decreased by 5% for each additional 10 days or participation in NFP

Low Birth Weight < 2500 Gram:

- The odds of low birth weight were 33% lower for NFP participants
- For every 10 days of participation in NFP, the odds of low birth weight decreased by 3%

Well-Child Visits:

- The odds of at least one well-child visit were 4.7 times more likely for NFP participants
- For every additional 10 nurse visits, the odds of a well-child visit increased by 36%


Vaccinations

- The odds of vaccinating were 5.5 times more likely for NFP participants
- For every additional 10 nurse visits, the odds of vaccinating increased by 37%

Our brains are almost entirely dependent on what they encounter on their ride to full development.

80-85% of our physical brains will be developed within the first three years of our lives.


Strong language environments in the first three years positively impact and essentially predict the design of our entire lives.

It's in homes and communities where the foundations for learning begin, not schools.






Early Childhood 30 Million Word Gap





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
What is vroom


- An app that provides parents and caregivers with ways to boost early learning Brain building activities.
- Makes it easy for parents and caregivers to access Vroom activities any time.
- Developed by leaders in neuroscience, psychology, behavioral economics, parenting and early childhood who have dedicated their lives to understanding early learning.











When you are doing laundry, sing about every step, putting in detergent, closing the door, folding the clothes, etc. Watch Robert and copy the sounds he makes so you can create a song together. This is fun and puts a new spin on this chore.




Brainy Background

When Robert hears new sounds and sees you respond to the sounds he makes, he is focused and engaged. When Robert is focused and engaged, he is learning new words and sounds that will help him learn to talk and read in the future.




Daily Vroom

- Sends a daily, personalized (age, gender) brain building activity for the child.
- Brain building activities in 16 different categories changing diapers, getting dressed, in the car, at the park, etc.
- Age appropriate tips for multiple children.
- Runs on a badge system: earn different badges for completing activities within the app.
- Available in English & Spanish







There is no time in life when the brain develops more rapidly than during the first five years. So by building children's brains from the earliest ages, we are actually shaping the foundation for future learning.


