Immigrants and refugees over the age of 60 are often vulnerable to loneliness and economic and health problems due to limited English language proficiency, little or no U.S. work experience, and weak ties to social institutions (src). Approximately 134,000 Salt Lake County residents (13%) are foreign-born. The New American elderly population is twice as likely to be in poverty as U.S.-born seniors. Salt Lake County's Adult and Aging Services operates 19 senior centers as a way of providing valuable resources and programs for seniors. As the elderly population grows, and the foreign-born population increases within this demographic, the Salt Lake County Mayor's Office for New Americans has identified two opportunities to serve their unique challenges via senior center programs. Through these efforts, seniors, particularly New Americans, will have the opportunity to improve their overall health.

The first component of this programming is designed to better seniors' financial health by teaching English and financial literacy. For foreign-born elderly individuals, limited language skills can be a barrier to a secure financial future and can lead to loneliness and isolation (src). By improving seniors' language and financial literacy capabilities, this program seeks to improve well-being in the foreign-born elderly population, giving them a more stable financial and social future and to preventing seniors from falling victim to predatory lending and scams.

Another part of the proposed programming at the senior centers involves improving elderly health by securing physical and financial access to fresh produce. As people age, proper nutrition plays an increasingly important role in their physical and mental wellbeing. Although many elderly New Americans arrive in the states physically healthy, limited financial resources and language barriers can lead them to adopt less healthy eating practices and can reduce their

access to quality healthcare (<u>src</u>). Approximately 15% of Utah seniors face the threat of hunger and over 50,000 seniors report they are currently struggling with hunger (2010 Census).

In 2016, USU Extension partnered with Salt Lake County Adult and Aging Services to launch pop-up farmers markets to disseminate locally grown, culturally appropriate free produce at senior centers throughout the county. 96% of those surveyed stated that the markets helped them save money, and 85% reported an increase in their consumption of fresh fruits and vegetables. Because New American seniors are more often afflicted by poverty, they benefit physically and emotionally from having fresh produce that is native to their homelands and familiar to them. Program growth requires more produce; planting a new garden would increase both the quality and reach of the program.

The development and implementation of these programs in tandem across Salt Lake County will improve the overall health and well-being of seniors, particularly New Americans. Estimated cost for the ESL and financial literacy class is \$35,000 annually, while the free produce program's cost is \$10,000. This application serves as a request for a grant of \$30,000, with \$20,000 allocated for ESL and financial literacy, and \$10,000 to help develop a new garden at Wheeler Farm to grown produce that are familiar to new American seniors.

Much of the existing programming for New Americans within Salt Lake County focuses on younger populations like children and those who are currently in the workforce. This leaves many older immigrants and refugees with fewer opportunities to make connections to the community and to receive critical care. This is especially detrimental to New Americans, many of whom come from communities where they are accustomed to having a large familial presence in their lives and a close-knit local community; for these individuals, transitioning to life in Salt Lake County often means learning to deal with social isolation. This isolation is often exacerbated by a lack of English skills, leaving New American seniors vulnerable to diminished emotional and mental health.

Moreover, many elderly individuals in Utah struggle with poverty, and the New American population is especially susceptible to this condition. Poverty affects many aspects of one's health, and can be particularly damaging for seniors, whose ability to augment their income is often diminished by a lack of physical and/or mental mobility, frequently leaving them with a great deal of stress. A lack of financial resources often leads to Utah seniors facing hunger and not being able to afford nutritious foods and adequate health care.

The financial literacy and ESL portion of the programming will be conducted using curriculum from the Family Prosperity Initiative. This initiative was founded by Salt Lake County library services to provide an innovative approach to financial education for low income

individuals, families and communities. FPI's curriculum is designed to improve participant financial literacy through evidence-based and culturally adapted curriculum that addresses basic financial concepts as well as the specific needs of the families participating. The curriculum's design allows it to be incorporated into ESL classes and is built with immigrants and refugees in mind.

This curriculum has measures of success built into the classes. (Ask Zee to help elaborate here).

The farmers market component of the proposed programming will undergo evaluation via surveys. During last year's programming, nearly 20% of the patrons of the farmers markets completed a survey measuring the ability of the markets to meet the goals of the program. This year, we would like to increase the percent of participant seniors who take the survey to 35%. Survey responses will be used to gauge the effectiveness of the program and to gather input on what improvements should be made.

This proposed programming will benefit the LMI community by providing essential services to those who might not normally have financial or physical access to such programs.

The ESL and financial literacy class will give seniors a brighter financial future by equipping them with the linguistic and financial tools needed to take care of their finances and protect themselves from predatory lending and financial mishaps. Providing ESL instruction alongside the financial literacy curriculum allows the program to tackle two difficulties at once in a way that is sensible and complementary. Additionally, although there may be free ESL classes provided at other locations, bringing the courses directly to the target audience will increase participation and retention. Moreover, because the curriculum is developed specifically with New American seniors in mind, it will undoubtedly prove to be more effective than if the seniors were to pursue similar opportunities outside of senior centers.

Teaching LMI individuals English can improve their quality of life by allowing them to communicate with a wider variety of individuals and by opening them up more to the world around them. Understanding the language primarily spoken in one's country of residence can act as a powerful integration mechanism and can give one a sense of community. This is key for seniors who often struggle with social isolation, especially New Americans who may not have many existing ties to the community.

Understanding basic financial literacy is also beneficial for elderly individuals who may be contacted for predatory lending schemes and are often preyed on for financial scams. Moreover, understanding financial literacy can help seniors in poverty by equipping them with the skills to effectively manage their money and improve their financial knowledge. Having a course dedicated to teaching these skills to the elderly specifically is helpful for seniors who learn differently and sometimes at a slower pace than younger populations.

The free produce program will also positively impact the elderly population, especially New Americans who frequently struggle with poverty and may have difficulty maintaining a healthy diet due to financial restrictions and a lack of produce they are familiar with and know how to prepare. Providing elderly individuals with free, nutritious produce will improve their quality of life by improving their physical health, mitigating the risk of some diseases through proper nutrition, decreasing mental and financial stress, and reducing instances of hunger.

Employment Transportation Support: From 2014-16, several of the cities and Salt Lake County entered an interlocal agreement to develop a Street Engagement Team (SET) to further outreach efforts in the community to encourage those who were experiencing homelessness to take advantage of services.
