 personnel. I designed, developed and taught large automation systems functions
 and operational maintenance requirements.
 - 1971-1972: Systems Performance Specialist at the Ronkonkoma, NY, ARTCC in the Test Management Organization implementing the transition to new IBM-360 based flight and radar data processing systems for ATC.
 - 1966-1971: Computer technician/programmer in a new computer-based ATC radar facility at the JFK International Airport, NY.
 - 1967-1972: I was also owner & proprietor of "Young's," a popular and successful toy store and bicycle shop in East Hampton, New York.
