COLLECTION AGREEMENT Between SALT LAKE COUNTY PARKS AND RECREATION And The UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE, U.S. FOREST SERVICE INTERMOUNTAIN REGION UINTA-WASATCH-CACHE NATIONAL FOREST SALT LAKE RANGER DISTRICT

This COLLECTION AGREEMENT is hereby entered into by and between Salt Lake County Parks and Recreation, hereinafter referred to as "SL County", and the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA), Forest Service, Intermountain Region, Uinta-Wasatch-Cache National Forest, Salt Lake Ranger District, hereinafter referred to as the "U.S. Forest Service," under the provisions of the Cooperative Funds Act of June 30, 1914 (16 U.S.C. 498 as amended by Pub. L. 104-127).

Background: In 2016, the Salt Lake County voters approved the spending of \$1,000,000 by the SL County Parks and Recreation Program for improvement of mountainous trails within Salt Lake County. This bond money was issued in recognition that sustainable trails offering desirable recreation opportunities help Salt Lake County residents by both providing them with recreation opportunities and by boosting the economy through tourism. The County seeks to commit this money to improve trails over a broad region and a broad spectrum of recreational opportunities.

Many of the mountainous trails within Salt Lake County are on National Forest System (NFS) lands, and are managed and maintained by the Salt Lake Ranger District. The SL County and the Salt Lake Ranger District have a long history of working together to build and improve trails of mutual benefit on NFS lands. Examples include new construction of the Bonneville Shoreline Trail (BST) between the "Z-Trail" and Heughes Canyon, the Red Pine reroute in Millcreek Canyon, and Lambs Canyon renovation in Parleys.

The purpose of this action is to provide an opportunity to substantially improve recreation opportinities in Salt Lake County. Money contributed by the County will be matched by other organizations, leading to the completion of the projects listed in clause "I. PURPOSE."

Mutual Interest and Benefit Statement:

Salt Lake County Parks and Recreation's mission is to provide many parks, trails, open spaces, and recreation programs to enhance the environment and the lives of the people they serve.



The U.S. Forest Service has the responsibility to provide, sustain and enhance outdoor recreation opportunities for the American public to develop healthy lifestyles through enjoyment of National Forest System lands.

<u>Title</u>: Mountainous Trails on the Salt Lake Ranger District

- I. PURPOSE: The purpose of this agreement, and incorporated Financial Plan, is to document the voluntary contribution of funds from SL County to the U.S. Forest Service to partially fund the following projects on National Forest System lands on Salt Lake Ranger District.
 - -- Beginning a new section of Bonneville Shoreline Trail (BST) between the "Z-Trail" and Neffs Canyon Trailhead.
 - Converting a section of the Dog Lake Trail in Big Cottonwood from steep and eroded to gradual and biker-friendly.
 - -- Making Mill B North Trail an attractive connection between the Mill B Trailhead and the Desolation Trail.
 - Building new trail between Elbow Fork and Upper Bigwater in Millcreek to get bikers off the single lane road.
 - -- Constructing 1.5 miles of reroute to the very popular Little Cottonwood Red Pine Lake to improve hiker experience and to protect Wilderness character,
 - -- Trail Sign Replacement.
 - Addressing erosion and tread issues on the Mormon Pioneer Trail in Parley's Canyon and the Wasatch Crest Trail between Guardsman Pass and Millcreek.

II. THE SL COUNTY SHALL:

- A. <u>LEGAL AUTHORITY</u>. SL County shall have the legal authority to enter into this agreement, and the institutional, managerial, and financial capability to ensure proper planning, management, and completion of the project, which includes funds sufficient to pay the nonfederal share of project costs, when applicable.
- B. Perform in accordance with the Financial Plan.
- C. Upon presentation of a Bill for Collection, deposit with the U.S. Forest Service the amount agreed to in the Financial Plan.



III.THE U.S. FOREST SERVICE SHALL:

A. ADVANCE BILLING. The maximum total cost liability to SL County for this agreement is \$335,000. The U.S. Forest Service shall bill SL County, prior to commencement of work, for deposits sufficient to cover the estimated costs (excluding overhead) for the specific payment period. Overhead shall not be assessed on SL County or U.S. Forest Service funds as there is mutual benefit between the parties. (Reference Forest Service direction in FSH 1909.13, Chapter 40 regarding mutual benefit.)

If payment is not received to the satisfaction of the U.S. Forest Service by the date specified on the Bill for Collection (Form FS-6500-89), the U.S. Forest Service shall exercise its rights regarding the collection of debts owed to the United States.

- B. <u>SPECIAL BILLING REQUIREMENTS PROGRAM DOCUMENTATION</u>. The U.S. Forest Service Program Manager shall provide SL County with a written report that meets SL County's specific documentation requirements.
- C. Perform in accordance with the attached Financial Plan. Cost savings from one of the above listed projects can be applied to another of the listed projects without formally modifying this agreement.
- D. Hire, train, and supervise U.S. Forest Service personnel.
- E. Provide a liaison to Cottonwood Canyons Foundation for volunteer coordination per separate agreement with U.S. Forest Service.
- F. Provide transportation to work site(s) and equipment needed for trail building projects.
- G. Enter into contracts or agreements with partners to complete work requiring specialized skills or equipment.

- B. <u>REFUNDS</u>. Funds collected in advance by the U.S. Forest Service, which are not spent or obligated for the project(s) approved under this agreement, may be refunded to SL County, authorized for use for a new agreement by SL County, or waived by SL County. A Data Universal Numbering System (DUNS) number and registration in the System for Award Management (SAM) by SL County may be necessary to process a refund. Due to processing costs, any balance less than \$25 shall not be refunded to SL County.
- C. <u>MEMBERS OF CONGRESS</u>. Pursuant to 41 U.S.C. 22, no member of, or delegate to, Congress shall be admitted to any share or part of this agreement, or benefits that may arise therefrom, either directly or indirectly.



- D. <u>TRIBAL EMPLOYMENT RIGHTS ORDINANCE (TERO)</u>. The U.S. Forest Service recognizes and honors the applicability of the Tribal laws and ordinances developed under the authority of the Indian Self-Determination and Educational Assistance Act of 1975 (PL 93-638).
- E. <u>FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT (FOIA)</u>. Public access to agreement records must not be limited, except when such records must be kept confidential and would have been exempted from disclosure pursuant to Freedom of Information regulations (5 U.S.C. 552). Requests for research data are subject to 2 CFR 215.36.

Public access to culturally sensitive data and information of Federally-recognized Tribes may also be explicitly limited by P.L. 110-234, Title VIII Subtitle B §8106 (2009 Farm Bill).

- F. <u>PARTICIPATION IN SIMILAR ACTIVITIES</u>. This agreement in no way restricts the U.S. Forest Service or SL County from participating in similar activities with other public or private agencies, organizations, and individuals.
- G. <u>ENDORSEMENT</u>. Any of SL County's contributions made under this agreement do not by direct reference or implication convey U.S. Forest Service endorsement of SL County's products or activities and does not by direct reference or implication convey the SL County's endorsement of the U.S. Forest Service products or activities.
- H. <u>NOTICES</u>. Any communication affecting the operations covered by this agreement by the U.S. Forest Service or SL County will be sufficient only if in writing and delivered in person, mailed, or transmitted electronically by e-mail or fax, as follows:

To the U.S. Forest Service Program Manager, at the address specified in the agreement.

To SL County, at SL County's address shown in the agreement or such other address designated within the agreement.

Notices are effective when delivered in accordance with this provision, or on the effective date of the notice, whichever is later.

I. <u>COLLABORATION</u>. The U.S. Forest Service and SL County may mutually agree to collaborate in the review of draft publications, interpretive signs, manuscripts, and other printed material and audiovisuals prior to completion. This agreement, in and of itself, does not authorize SL County's participation in the project.



- J. <u>USE OF U.S. FOREST SERVICE INSIGNIA</u>. In order for SL County to use the U.S. Forest Service insignia on any published media, such as a Web page, printed publication, or audiovisual production, permission must be granted from the U.S. Forest Service's Office of Communications (Washington Office). A written request will be submitted by U.S. Forest Service, Intermountain Region, Uinta-Wasatch-Cache National Forest to the Office of Communications Assistant Director, Visual Information and Publishing Services prior to use of the insignia. The U.S. Forest Service, Uinta-Wasatch-Cache National Forest will notify SL County when permission is granted.
- K. <u>U.S. FOREST SERVICE ACKNOWLEDGED IN PUBLICATIONS</u>, <u>AUDIOVISUALS</u>, <u>AND ELECTRONIC MEDIA</u>. SL County shall acknowledge U.S. Forest Service support in any publications, audiovisuals, and electronic media developed as a result of this agreement.
- L. <u>PROPERTY IMPROVEMENTS</u>. Improvements placed by SL County on National Forest System land, at the direction or with the approval of the U.S. Forest Service, become property of the United States. These improvements are subject to the same regulations and administration of the U.S. Forest Service as would other national forest improvements of a similar nature. No part of this agreement entitles SL County to any interest in the improvements, other than the right to use them under applicable U.S. Forest Service regulations.
- M. <u>PURCHASE OF ASSETS</u>. Any assets (such as equipment, property, or improvements) purchased by the U.S. Forest Service with SL County's contributions shall become the property of the U.S. Forest Service.
- N. TRAINING, EVALUATION, AND CERTIFICATION OF SAWYERS. Any of the SL County employees, and any participants and volunteers engaged on behalf of the SL County and U.S. Forest Service, who will use chainsaws or crosscut saws on National Forest System lands to conduct the program of work contained in this agreement must be trained, evaluated, and certified in accordance with U.S. Forest Service Manual 2358 and U.S. Forest Service Handbook 6709.11, section 22.48b. The SL County is responsible for providing this training, evaluation, and certification, unless the U.S. Forest Service and the SL County determine it is not in the best interest of the partnership. In these circumstances, the U.S. Forest Service, upon request and based on availability of agency funding and personnel, may assist with developing and conducting training, evaluation, and certification of the SL County's employees, and any volunteers and participants engaged on behalf of the SL County and the U.S. Forest Service, who will use chainsaws or crosscut saws on National Forest System lands.
- O. <u>OFFSETS, CLAIMS AND RIGHTS</u>. Any and all activities entered into or approved by this agreement will create and support afforestation/reforestation efforts within the National Forest System without generating carbon credits. The U.S. Forest Service does not make claims of permanence or any guarantees of carbon sequestration on lands



reforested or afforested through partner assistance. The U.S. Forest Service will provide for long-term management of reforested and afforested lands, according to applicable Federal statute regulations and forest plans.

P. NONDISCRIMINATION STATEMENT - PRINTED, ELECTRONIC, OR AUDIOVISUAL MATERIAL. SL County shall include the following statement, in full, in any printed, audiovisual material, or electronic media for public distribution developed or printed with any Federal funding.

In accordance with Federal law and U.S. Department of Agriculture policy, this institution is prohibited from discriminating on the basis of race, color, national origin, sex, age, or disability. (Not all prohibited bases apply to all programs.)

- Q. <u>TERMINATION FOR COLLECTION AGREEMENTS</u>. Either party, in writing, may terminate this agreement in whole, or in part, at any time before the date of expiration. The U.S. Forest Service shall not incur any new obligations for the terminated portion of this agreement after the effective date of termination and shall cancel as many obligations as possible. Full credit must be allowed for U.S. Forest Service expenses and all non-cancelable obligations properly incurred up to the effective date of termination.
- R. <u>DEBARMENT AND SUSPENSION</u>. SL County shall immediately inform the U.S. Forest Service if they or any of their principals are presently excluded, debarred, or suspended from entering into covered transactions with the Federal Government according to the terms of 2 CFR Part 180. Additionally, should SL County or any of their principals receive a transmittal letter or other official Federal notice of debarment or suspension, then they shall notify the U.S. Forest Service without undue delay. This applies whether the exclusion, debarment, or suspension is voluntary or involuntary.
- S. <u>MODIFICATIONS</u>. Modifications within the scope of this agreement must be made by mutual consent of the parties, by the issuance of a written modification signed and dated by all properly authorized, signatory officials, prior to any changes being performed. Requests for modification should be made, in writing, at least 30 days prior to implementation of the requested change. The U.S. Forest Service is not obligated to fund any changes not properly approved in advance.



- T. <u>COMMENCEMENT/EXPIRATION DATE</u>. This agreement is executed as of the date of the last signature, and is effective through May 31, 2022 at which time it will expire. The expiration date is the final date for completion of all work activities under this agreement.
- U. <u>AUTHORIZED REPRESENTATIVES</u>. By signature below, each party certifies that the individuals listed in this document as representatives of the individual parties are authorized to act in their respective areas for matters related to this agreement.
