Pledge of Allegiance

Ms. Callista Pearson, Marketing and Public Relations, Animal Services Division, led the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America.

2. CITIZEN PUBLIC INPUT

Mr. Lawrence Horman stated housing is a desperate need in this community. Homeless people need a place to stay for more than a few hours when they fall sick. Most homeless people do not have a friend or family member to go to if they need help.

Mr. Bill Tibbitts, Crossroads Urban Center, stated one of his priorities for years has been reducing homelessness for children. Babies are homeless more than any other age group. He is excited the Mayor has proposed putting money into types of housing designed to get families out of homelessness.

Mr. Steve Klemz, United Today Stronger Tomorrow, stated he commended the Council for its due diligence in learning about ARPA funding guidelines. He understood it was hard work to decide what to do with ARPA funding. There are many broken systems that lead to homelessness in Utah, and systemic breakdowns put pressure on local businesses and churches who are left to navigate the realities of homelessness. Investing in affordable housing is an important step toward fixing broken systems for the sake of human dignity.

Mr. Steve Van Maren stated the agenda did not contain any informational attachments on the Green Well Project near the Riverbend Golf Course, which was discussed during the Council Work Session today. He would like that to be backfilled into the agenda.

3.1. Council Members

Council Member Stringham introduced Illia Naiier and Anzhelika Naiier (Martyrosian), who she met last night at an event in support of Ukraine at the State Capitol.

Mr. Illia Naiier stated he is grateful to the Council for letting him share his story and to the United States for showing its care and support. The situation in Ukraine is very difficult for his family members who continue to live there. He wants people to understand that the citizens of Ukraine are fighting for their freedom and their lives, and this is not something he could have predicted growing up. He wants people to understand that the events occurring in Ukraine are a result of people believing in false propaganda perpetuated by the media.

Ms. Anzhelika Naiier (Martyrosian) stated her family is in the East of Ukraine and she has been in occupied territories. She has no connection with her parents and no way to contact them. She knows her home city, Mariupol, is being bombed. Citizens are dying, including infants. She hopes that through awareness, people will all be able to protect their families and the world against the "cancer" of invasion.

Council Member Snelgrove asked if there were charities that were accepting donations to relief efforts in Ukraine.

Mr. Naiier stated Ukrainian Armed Forces is accepting donations and he will be happy to share the information.

Council Member Stringham stated the County is flying the Ukrainian flag in front of the building and in Council Chambers as a show of support of Ukraine.

Council Member Theodore stated she recently went on a Canyon Patrol ride-along and it was a good experience. She was able to see how busy the canyons can get.

RECITALS

A. Salt Lake County (the "County") and Salt Lake City Corporation (the "City") are "public agencies" as defined by the Utah Interlocal Cooperation Act, Utah Code Ann. §§ 11-13- 101 et seq. (the "Cooperation Act"), and, as such, are authorized by the Cooperation Act to enter into this Agreement to act jointly and cooperatively on the basis of mutual advantage in order to provide facilities in a manner that will accord best with geographic, population and other factors economic. influencing the needs and development of local communities.

B. The County receives funds ("<u>TRCC Funds</u>") pursuant to the Tourism, Recreation, Cultural, Convention, and Airport Facilities Tax Act, Utah Code Ann. §§ 59-12-601 et seq. (the "<u>TRCC Act</u>"). The TRCC Act provides that TRCC Funds may be used, among other things, for the development, operation, and maintenance of publicly owned or operated recreation, cultural, or convention facilities.

C. The City requested TRCC Funds from the County to help it fund the project described in its TRCC Application. More specifically, the City

requested TRCC Funds to fund the complete replacement of the baseball playing surface at the City-owned Smith's Ballpark (the "<u>Project</u>"). The County Council appropriated TRCC Funds for this purpose.

D. On March 6, 2020, Salt Lake County Mayor Jennifer Wilson declared a State of Emergency related to the novel coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19). This emergency event directly and significantly decreased TRCC revenue generated from restaurant, car rental and transient room tax, preventing the County from fully complying with its funding commitments under the initial Agreement and any subsequent amendment.

E. Now that there are sufficient TRCC Funds to fund the Project, City and County now desire to enter into the Interlocal Cooperation Agreement attached hereto as ATTACHMENT A (the "<u>Interlocal Agreement</u>") wherein the County agrees to grant TRCC Funds to the City to help fund the Project and wherein the City agrees to abide by the terms and conditions outlined in the Agreement.

F. The County Council believes that its contribution and assistance under the Agreement will contribute to the prosperity, moral well-being, peace and comfort of Salt Lake County residents.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED, by the County Council of Salt Lake County:

WITNESSETH

A. Salt Lake County (the "County") owns fee title to several parcels of real property at 11196 South Redwood Road, South Jordan, Utah, identified as Parcel Nos. 27-22-126-027, 27- 22-176-020, and 27-22-176-021 (the "County Property").

B. The County initially entered into an agreement to sell the County Property

in 2019, but that contract fell through and is now terminated.

C. After marketing the County Property again in December 2021, the County received several offers, including one from Clay and Kelly Keller (the "Buyers") that Salt Lake County determined to be the highest and best offer.

D. Buyers offered to purchase the property for \$2,425,000.00, which has been reviewed and approved by Salt Lake County Real Estate Division as a fair market value for the County Property.

E. The County and Buyers have negotiated to convey the County Property pursuant to the terms and conditions of a Real Estate Purchase and Sale Agreement ("Purchase Agreement") attached hereto as Exhibit 1.

F. The County previously held a public hearing to dispose of the County Property on January 8, 2019 and declared the County Property surplus.

G. It has been determined that the best interests of the County and the general public will be served by conveying the County Property to the Buyers as proposed in the attached Purchase Agreement. The conveyance of the County Property will comply with all applicable state statutes and County ordinances.
