ORDINANCE NO. 1897

AN THE **ORDINANCE OF SALT** LAKE **COUNTY COUNCIL AMENDING SECTION** 19.04.462 OF THE LAKE **COUNTY** SALT CODE TO INCLUDE WEDDING AND RECEPTION USES IN THE DEFINITION OF RESTAURANT, LIQUOR LICENSE; AND TO ENACT RELATED REGULATIONS

The County Legislative Body of Salt Lake County ordains as follows:

SECTION I. The amendments made here are designated by underlining the new substituted words. Words being deleted are designated by brackets and interlineations.

SECTION II. Section 19.04.462 of the Salt Lake County Code of Ordinances is amended as follows in order to include wedding and reception uses in the definition of Restaurant, Liquor License; and to enact related regulations.

19.04.462 Restaurant liquor license.

"Restaurant liquor license" means a public restaurant authorized by the state alcoholic beverage control commission as a liquor outlet allowing the storage, sale and consumption of liquor and alcohol on the premises. Weddings, receptions, and similar events are included in such use.

SECTION III. This ordinance shall become effective fifteen days after its passage and upon publication of the ordinance, or a summary thereof on the Utah state noticing website.

A. Pursuant to Utah Code Annotated Section 17-50-303(3), a county may

- C. The Salt Lake County Council desires to contribute County property by permitting Partners to lease space at Copperview Recreation Center owned by Salt Lake County at a rate lower than fair market value.
- D. The Salt Lake County Council finds that this contribution will benefit the residents of Salt Lake County by providing low cost space to Partners, contributing to the safety, health, prosperity, moral well-being, peace, order, comfort, and/or convenience of county residents.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED, by the Salt Lake County Council that:

- 1. The Salt Lake County Mayor is authorized to execute an agreement leasing a portion of the Copperview Recreation Center to Partners for less than fair market value.
- 2. In the judgement of the Salt Lake County Council, the above contribution to Partners contributes to the safety, health, prosperity, moral well-being, peace, order, comfort, and convenience of Salt Lake County residents.

RESOLUTION OF THE **SALT LAKE COUNTY COUNCIL** THE **APPROVING** RECOMMENDATION OF THE **SALT LAKE** COUNTY COUNCIL OF GOVERNMENTS AND AUTHORIZING **EXECUTION** OF AN **INTERLOCAL COOPERATION AGREEMENT PROVIDING FOR** THE **TRANSFER** OF \$315,000 OF **COUNTY WEST** CORRIDOR PRESERVATION FUNDS TO **JORDAN CITY** BE USED BY THE CITY TO ACQUIRE CERTAIN PROPERTY FOR TRANSPORTATION PURPOSES.

RECITALS

WHEREAS, Salt Lake County (the "County") and West Jordan City (the "City") are "public agencies" as defined by the Utah Interlocal Cooperation Act, UTAH CODE §§ 11-13-101 to -608, and as such, are authorized to enter into an interlocal cooperation agreement to act jointly and cooperatively on the basis of mutual advantage;

WHEREAS, during the 2015 General Session, the State Legislature amended Section 72-2-117.5 of the Utah Transportation Code, UTAH CODE §§

72-1-101 to -16-402, to provide corridor preservation funds to local counties for disbursement to various cities and governmental entities, as recommended and endorsed by a council of governments (hereinafter "Corridor Preservation Funds");

WHEREAS, the Salt Lake County Council of Governments ("COG"), an association of local governments in Salt Lake County, requested that the County Council approve its recommended distribution to the City from the Salt Lake County Corridor Preservation Fund to enable the City to acquire property needed for a transportation project considered and approved by COG at approximately 5875 West 8200 South in Salt Lake County, consistent with the purpose and requirements of Utah Code §72-2-117.5. A copy of the COG recommendation letters, dated October 24, 2019, and December 20, 2021, are attached hereto as ATTACHMENT "A" and ATTACHMENT "B", respectively; and

WHEREAS, the County and the City now desire to enter into the interlocal cooperation agreement attached hereto as ATTACHMENT "C" (the "Interlocal Agreement") providing for the transfer of Three Hundred Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$315,000) of Corridor Preservation Funds to the City to be used by the City as described in the Interlocal Agreement and in accordance with Utah Code §72-2-117.5.

RESOLUTION

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED, by the County Council of Salt Lake County:

- 1. That the recommendation of the Salt Lake County Council of Governments to transfer County Corridor Preservation Funds to West Jordan City for the project described in its recommendation letters is approved.
- 2. That the Interlocal Agreement between Salt Lake County and West Jordan City is approved, in substantially the form attached hereto as ATTACHMENT "C", and that the Salt Lake County Mayor is authorized to execute the same.
- 3. That the Interlocal Agreement will become effective as stated in the Interlocal Agreement.
