Tuesday, May 1, 2018. The motion passed unanimously, showing that all Council Members present voted "Aye."

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Council Member DeBry spoke under "Report of Council Members" reporting on Council Member Sam Granato's funeral service, stating it was a what a nice tribute for a great man.

Council Member Wilson spoke under "Report of Council Members" stating she attended the services too and was moved by the comments and those present. It was still hard to be one team member down.

Council Member Bradshaw spoke under "Report of Council Members" stating Council Member Granato loved serving on this Council. His obituary was modeled after his campaign door hanger, and the door hangers will now be souvenirs.

Council Member Wilson spoke under "Report of Council Members" reporting she attended last night's drug court graduation, which was inspirational. She was moved by the challenge these individuals face and their willingness to step forward. Judges operate from the heart to support these individuals, and if others did the same, these individuals would come out ahead.

WHEREAS, County and City desire to enter into an Interlocal Cooperation Agreement ("the Agreement") whereby the County will contribute the Recreation Bonds funds requested by City for City to construct the Facility; and

WHEREAS, the adoption of the Agreement is made pursuant to the Utah Interlocal Cooperation Act. U.C. A. § 11-13-101 et seq. (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, the Agreement requires the City to construct an improvement to real property thereby requiring approval of the County's legislative body pursuant to the Act; and

WHEREAS, the adoption of the Agreement is in the best interests of the parties and in furtherance of the public interest.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Salt Lake County Council that the Interlocal Cooperation Agreement between the County and the City be accepted and approved and the Mayor of Salt Lake County is hereby authorized to execute the Interlocal Cooperation Agreement.

WHEREAS, County and City desire to enter into an Interlocal Cooperation Agreement ("the Agreement") whereby the County will contribute the Recreation Bonds funds requested by City for City to complete the desired improvements to its Facility; and

WHEREAS, the adoption of the Agreement is made pursuant to the Utah Interlocal Cooperation Act. U.C. A. § 11-13-101 et seq. (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, the Agreement requires the City to construct an improvement to real property thereby requiring approval of the County's legislative body pursuant to the Act; and

WHEREAS, the adoption of the Agreement is in the best interests of the parties and in furtherance of the public interest.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Salt Lake County Council that the Interlocal Cooperation Agreement between the County and the City be accepted and approved and the Mayor of Salt Lake County is hereby authorized to execute the Interlocal Cooperation Agreement.
