Professional Qualifications

With over 35 years of airport management experience and 29 of these as the CEO of three large hub airports, I have the reputation for effectively responding to changing economic and security conditions and for providing extremely high quality facilities and services to the travelling public and the airlines serving the community while maintaining a low cost structure.

During my three years as the Aviation General Manager for the Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta International airport, the busiest in the world, we completed construction and opened the new \$1.4 Billion International Terminal on time and within budget. The new project created a 40 Gate International Terminal Complex and brought our total gate count to 208. The all in Cost Per Enplaned Passenger (CPE) in Atlanta was approximately \$5.25 in 2012 which is well below the industry average of \$9.00. We also extended the airport's longest runway by 500 feet to accommodate long haul flights to foreign destinations and opened ATL's first cell phone and park and wait lot. The entire inbound roadway system, which is over 30 years old, is currently being expanded to better serve the access to and from the airport.

Tampa International Airport's CPE of \$4.93 in 2010 was one of the lowest for large hub airports in the United States. TPA generated 74% of its revenues from non passenger airline sources which was higher than the industry average of 50 to 55 percent. A major goal of the Authority was to accomplish our mission at the lowest possible cost and with the full cooperation of all of our partners including the airlines, the TSA, the FAA, concessionaires, FBO's and all of our tenants that provide services to the travelling public. This was evidenced by the following achievements during my tenure as the Executive Director:

The tragic events of September 11, 2001 had a major impact on our Nation's passengers and required a comprehensive security response. With the full support and cooperation of the 22 airlines serving TPA and that of the Transportation Security Administration (TSA), we were one of the first airports in the United States to develop and install an outbound baggage handling system with a fully integrated inline security system for checked baggage. In addition, we expanded the number of security lanes at the four security checkpoints from 9 to 27. Passenger traffic recovered to pre-9/11 volume within two years and then continued to grow faster than the national average through 2007 which was TPA's record year for the number of passengers served. The TSA selected me to serve on their Baggage Screening Investment Study Committee as one of 6 airport representatives along with airline and industry representatives and our goal was to find alternatives to fund the procurement of Inline Baggage Screening Systems at our Nation's airports. I was also selected by the Federal Bureau of Investigation to

serve on the Countywide Joint Terrorism Task Force which required me to obtain an FBI Top Secret Clearance.

In 1998 I renegotiated the 30 year old Airline-Airport Use and Lease Agreement for operations at TPA. The airline agreement converted from a pure residual agreement to a compensatory rate making methodology with an airline revenue sharing component. The new agreement allowed the Aviation Authority to complete in excess of \$1.3 billion of capital projects during my 13 years and actually reduce the costs to the airlines to operate at the airport. The flexibility of the new agreement and our ability to respond to economic changes has positioned the Aviation Authority well to respond to the current economic situation. We continued with a strong capital program and were still able to pay revenue sharing to the airlines while at the same time to reduce expenses without resorting to employee lay-offs.

A Federal Aviation Regulation Part 150 Noise Control and Land Use Compatibility Study for operations at TPA was completed in 2002. The study was in accordance with FAA regulations and involved the community and the airlines to the maximum extent possible. The results of the noise study included changes to the preferential runway use program at TPA which reduced the noise impact on the residential community. An Aircraft Noise and Operations Monitoring System with remote monitoring sites and integration with the FAA's radar tracking system to review compliance with the preferential runway use program was implemented. An engine run-up enclosure was constructed to further reduce noise impacts on the community.

During the thirteen years I served as the Executive Director we completed in excess of \$1.3 billion in capital projects and land acquisition; and, during this period of time we actually reduced the CPE charged to the airlines from \$5.63 in 1996 to the \$4.93 actual for the fiscal year ended September 30, 2009. Information about the Aviation System in Hillsborough County

The Hillsborough County Aviation Authority was created in 1945 and is an Independent Special District governed by a five member Aviation Authority Board consisting of 3 members appointed by the Governor of the State of Florida for four-year terms; the Mayor of the City of Tampa; and a Commissioner of and selected by the Board of County Commissioners of Hillsborough County. The Aviation Authority is responsible for all public airports within Hillsborough County and currently owns and operates Tampa International, a large hub airport serving the Tampa Bay Area and Peter O. Knight, Plant City and Tampa Executive airports which all serve as relievers to TPA. The Aviation Authority is a self-supporting organization and generates revenues from airport users of approximately \$170 million and PFC collections of approximately \$37 million. These revenues are used to fund operating expenses of approximately \$92 million; debt service payments of approximately \$72 million; and, capital projects, land acquisition and equipment of \$105 million. I was directly responsible and accountable for the planning & development, operations, maintenance, marketing, public relations, finance and administrative functions of the airports owned and operated by the Aviation Authority.

Information about Salt Lake City's Airport System

The SLC Department of Airports is owned and operated by Salt Lake City Corporation and is responsible for the overall planning, development, financing, operations and maintenance of Salt Lake City International Airport (large hub), Salt Lake City Airport II (Reliever) and the Tooele Valley Airport (General Aviation). SLC created an Airport Advisory Board comprised of nine members appointed by the Mayor of Salt Lake City and confirmed by the City Council. The Executive Director of the Department of Airports is also a Member of the Mayor's Cabinet which oversees all of the operations and services provided by Salt Lake City.

Information about Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta International Airport

The airport, under the Department of Aviation (DOA), is owned and operated by the City of Atlanta and is the busiest airport in the world. The DOA is responsible for the overall planning, development, financing, operations and maintenance of the airport. The General Manager of the DOA serves on the Mayor's Cabinet and also works with the 16 Members of the Atlanta City Council relating to all Legislative items.
