 Performs professional planning work to include conducting planning studies, collecting and presenting data, and preparing reports in support of Salt Lake County's urban and regional planning, development, and zoning activities.

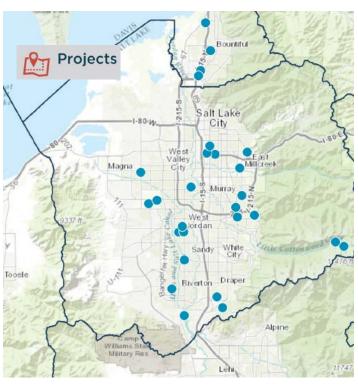

Transportation and Land Use Connection



- Provide local communities with technical assistance (staff time, consulting & training) - increase the number and scope of projects/plans completed
- Impact is three-fold:
 - Enhanced corridor/area planning
 - Integrated transportation and land use – saving resources in NEPA process
 - Enhanced areas of technical assistance

Director of Special Projects Coordination of Homeless Shelter Services & Coordinated Entry

- To ensure coordination with Housing & Community Development regarding Homeless Resources Centers and coordination of homeless services and system access/entry.
- This position would remain a time-limited position for 2019 and 2020 until new Homeless Resource Centers are open and coordinated entry is implemented.







Census Outreach Strategy Plan



- In 2020, there is a change in how the Census will be conducted
- Why is the census a big deal?
 The census not only counts populations it also sets up representation decisions for federal, state, and local governments
- A flawed census could hurt Utah's rural areas and marginalized communities
- George Washington University estimates each person creates \$1,086 per year of funding within the state of Utah







Community Service Navigator Pilot Program



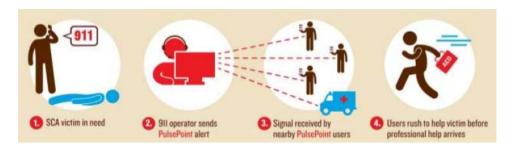
- A more holistic approach to help clients navigate the services available to them
- Service Navigators will work with various service providers in following up with clients – measuring continued outcome and impact of engaging the services supported by Salt Lake County
- Goal: to create a client-centered services system that could be replicated and scaled if successful







CPR/AED Mobile App Community Response System







- 1,000 + people/day nationally die from Sudden Cardiac Arrest many needlessly
- Local 9-1-1 system connects to mobile app and alerts CPR-trained citizens to someone nearby in distress
- Decreasing response time = increasing survival rate & patient outcome (reduced brain damage)









Regional Policy Development

Partners in the Community

Executive Partner – \$50,000

- Recognition: Verbal, print, and web recognition
- Access: Notice about products, research and analysis
- Engagement: Regular updates on progress of the Institute
- Presentations: Gardner Policy Institute director and staff will be present at Salt Lake County events
- **Betterment of the community:** Help the U give back to the community we love and serve with independent and credible research about important public policies

Oquirrh View Existing Conditions Plan



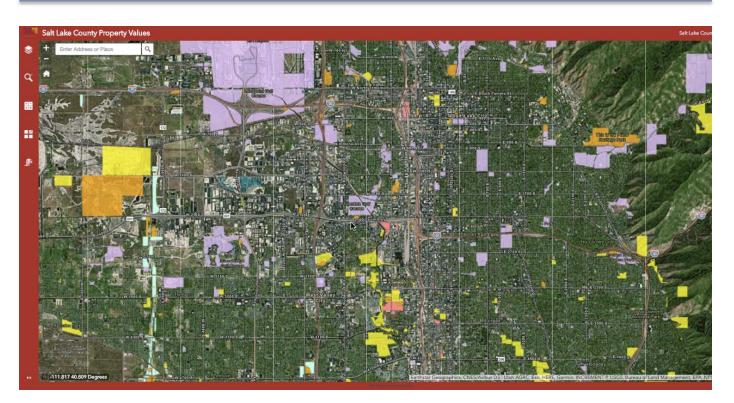
- By 2065, the valley's population is expected to grow by 600,0000

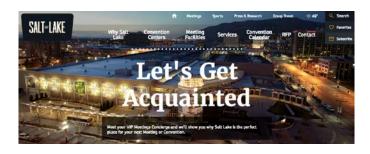




Visit Salt Lake
