Right of Way Vacation Summary and Recommendation

Public Body: Salt Lake County Council Meeting Date: March 5, 2019

Property Address: Approximately 496 W 13490 S

Request: Vacate a portion of an un-used right of way that had been deeded to the County by the Utah

Department of Transportation in 1945.

Planning Staff Recommendation: Approval of the vacation

Applicant Name: Mike Timothy on behalf of the Utah Department of Transportation

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

In 1945, a perpetual right of way was deeded to Salt Lake County from the Utah Department of Transportation. According to the deed, the right of way the intention was to "donate said right-of-way to said Salt Lake County for the use of the public as a highway." The right of way in question was never used or developed as a public street, but still shows as an incumbrance to the title of the underlying parcel, which is currently owned by UDOT. UDOT is looking to surplus the property to be developed by a private developer and has requested this right of way be vacated to facilitate the proposed development. Although the property is currently within the Draper city boundaries, the deed was specific to Salt Lake County and never transferred to the city, so action by the County is necessary to vacate the right of way.

PLANNING STAFF ANALYSIS

Applicable ordinances are:

<u>County Code 14.48.050</u> "No action shall be taken on any petition to vacate a street until the county real estate section identifies and verifies the specific manner in which the county acquired its interest in the street and the attorney determines the legal interest of the county in the street."

<u>County Code 14.48.060</u> "Each petition shall be evaluated in terms of the current use of the street and the need in the foreseeable future for its use as a public street or for any other public purpose. If such need exists or may exist in the foreseeable future, the petition shall be denied."

<u>Utah Code 17-27a-609.5(3)</u> "The legislative body may adopt an ordinance granting a petition to vacate some or all of a public street, right-of-way, or easement if the legislative body finds that:

- (a) good cause exists for the vacation; and
- (b) neither the public interest nor any person will be materially injured by the vacation."

PLANNING STAFF RECOMMENDATION

The analyses required above have been conducted (see attached), and we recommend approval of the request to vacate.

Re: Utah Department of Transportation Petition to Vacate Right-of-Way Interest

To Whom it May Concern:

The Petition to Vacate a Street, File # 30863, appears to be in order. Salt Lake County apparently acquired an interest in a perpetual right of way for the use of the public as a highway through a Right-of-Way Deed dated November 10, 1943. This deed was accepted by the Salt Lake County Board of County Commissioners on July 3, 1944, and it was recorded on April 23, 1945 in the Salt Lake County Recorder's Office. This right-of-way interest is located on the property currently owned by the State of Utah, by and through the Utah Department of Transportation.

It appears from reviewing aerial photographs of the area that there are no public roads in use within this right-of-way. Any vacation of this right of way should exempt existing public easements, rights-of-way, or other public uses of the area.

It is my opinion that any verified interest acquired by the County as determined by the County Real Estate Section that has not been previously legally conveyed away may be vacated pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 14.48 of the Salt Lake County Code of Ordinances.

STREET VACATION

AN ORDINANCE VACATING A RIGHT-OF-WAY INTEREST FOR THE USE OF A PUBLIC AS A HIGHWAY DONATED TO SALT LAKE COUNTY BY THE STATE OF UTAH

The County Legislative Body of Salt Lake County ordains as follows:

SECTION I. (1) A right-of-way interest for the use of the public as a highway donated to Salt Lake County by the State of Utah in 1945 through a Right of Way Deed, located at approximately 14425 South Bitterbrush Lane, 855 West 12300 South, and 496 West 13490 South, Draper, Utah, also identified as Parcel Nos. 33-02-200-0017, 33-02-400-005, and 33-01-102-003, which is more fully described in Exhibit "A" and incorporated herein by reference, is hereby vacated.

- (2) The purpose of the vacation is to accommodate the request of the Utah Department of Transportation, the underlying property owner, to remove the encumbrance upon the land created by the Right-of Way Deed, the need for which road no longer exists due to the existing surface street and freeway system in Salt Lake County.
- (3) This ordinance is based upon a determination by the County Legislative Body following a public hearing on March 5, 2019, that due and proper notice of the hearing to vacate the road was duly given according to law; that no objection was made to the proposed vacation; that good cause exists for the vacation; that neither the public interest nor any person will be materially injured by the vacation; that fair and adequate

consideration has been provided; and that the County has no present or foreseeable future public need for the road, or for any other public purpose.

- (4) All right, title and interest in and to the right-of-way being vacated is to revert, by operation of state law and county ordinances, to the underlying property owners.
- (5) This ordinance shall have no force or effect to impair any other existing easements or rights-of-way for public utilities, public franchises, irrigation, storm drainage, or other such easements, as presently exist under, over, or upon the vacated portions of said easement, or as are or may be shown on the official plats and records of the County.
- (6) The Salt Lake County Recorder is hereby directed to record this ordinance and make the necessary changes on the official plats and records of the County to reflect said ordinance.

SECTION II. This ordinance shall become effective 15 days after its passage and upon at least one publication of the ordinance or a summary of the ordinance in a newspaper published and having general circulation in Salt Lake County.
