#### **ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION**

OF

### SALT LAKE CENTER FOR ENGAGING COMMUNITY, INC.

THE UNDERSIGNED, natural person above the age of eighteen (18) years, acts as incorporator for SALT LAKE CENTER FOR ENGAGING COMMUNITY, INC., (the "Corporation") which is hereby organized under the Utah Revised Nonprofit Corporation Act, do adopt the following Articles of Incorporation for such Corporation:

**ARTICLE I** 

#### NAME

The name of the Corporation is SALT LAKE CENTER FOR ENGAGING **COMMUNITY, INC.** 

#### **ARTICLE II**

#### **PURPOSE**

The purpose of the Corporation is to be an independent, politically neutral 1. organization to support integral approaches to community flourishing for the public good in a global environment and engaging in related activities including but not limited to: modeling best practices of community flourishing; convening the diversity of a community for the public good; promoting full spectrum, civil, civic, service and character education; creating community networks and learning communities; engaging in educating, mentoring, consulting and research for such purposes.

2. The corporation is organized exclusively for charitable, religious, educational and scientific purposes, including, for such purposes, the making of distributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code. Amounts in excess of income may be distributed for that same purpose, at the sole discretion of the Trustees.

3. The corporation shall be a non-profit corporation under Article 1395-1.01 of the Utah Non-Profit Corporation Act. The purposes for which the corporation is formed are exclusively to receive and administer funds for charitable purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal

Revenue Code of 1954 as amended and, to that end, to take and hold by bequest, devise, gift, grant, purchase, lease or otherwise any property, real, personal, tangible or intangible, or any undivided interest therein, without limitation as to amount or value; to sell, convey, or otherwise dispose of any such property and to invest, reinvest, or deal with the principal or the income thereof in such manner as, in the judgment of the trustees, will best promote the purposes of the corporation without limitation, except such limitations, if any, as may be contained in the instrument under which such property is received, these Articles of Incorporation, the Bylaws of the Corporation, or any laws applicable thereto; to do any other act or thing incidental to or connected with the foregoing purposes or in advancement thereof, but not for the pecuniary profit or financial gain of its trustees or officers, except as permitted under the Utah Revised Nonprofit Corporation Act.

4. No part of the net earnings of the organization shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to its members, trustees, officers, or other private persons, except that the organization shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in the purpose clause hereof. No substantial part of the activities of the organization shall be the carrying on of propaganda or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in or intervene in (including the publication or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office. Notwithstanding any other provision of this document, the organization shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by an organization except from federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or (b) by an organization, contributions to which deductible under section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section 0 for the internal Revenue Code.

5. The corporation shall distribute its income for each taxable year at such time and in such manner so as not to become subject to the tax on undistributed income imposed by Section 4942 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 as amended, or corresponding provisions of any subsequent federal tax laws.

6. The corporation shall not engage in self-dealing defined in Section 4941(d) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 as amended, or corresponding provisions of any subsequent federal tax laws.

7. The corporation shall not retain any excess business holdings as defined in Section 4943(c) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 as amended, or corresponding provisions of any subsequent federal tax laws.

8. The corporation shall not make any investments in such manner so as to subject it to tax under Section 4944 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 as amended, or corresponding provisions of any subsequent federal tax laws.

9. The corporation shall not make any taxable expenditures as defined in Section 4945(d) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 as amended, or corresponding provisions of any subsequent federal tax laws.

10. Notwithstanding any other provision of these Articles of Incorporation, the corporation shall not conduct or carry on any activities not permitted to be conducted or carried on by an organization exempt under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 as amended and its regulations as they now exist or as they may hereafter be amended, or by an organization, contributions to which are deductible under Section 170(c)(2) of such Code and its regulations as they now exist or as they may hereafter be amended.

11. Upon the dissolution of the organization, assets shall be distributed for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or shall be distributed to the federal government, or to a state or local government, for a public purpose. Any such assets not disposed of shall be disposed of by the Court of Common Pleas of the county in which the principal office of the organization is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations, as said Court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.

#### **ARTICLE III**

#### MEMBERSHIP AND MANAGEMENT OF CORPORATION

The Corporation shall be managed by its board of trustees and will not have voting members. The corporation will not issue stock evidencing membership in the corporation or any rights, including water rights or other property rights with the Corporation.

#### **ARTICLE IV**

#### AMENDMENT

These Articles of Incorporation may be amended by the affirmative vote of 50 percent of the shares entitled to vote on each such amendment.

#### **ARTICLE V**

#### INITIAL REGISTERED OFFICE AND INITIAL REGISTERED AGENT
