Ms. Gayelene Gudmundson, Council Clerk's Office, led the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America.

Mr. Chad Booth, Producer, The County Seat, stated the television program is more than halfway through its ninth season. He wanted Council Members to let him know if they had questions or comments on topics.

Ms. Nichole Dunn, Chief of Staff to Congressman Ben McAdams, read a letter by Congressman McAdams applauding the County Council for its resolution regarding immigration and for being the first County in the United States to be officially certified in Welcoming America, and explaining his efforts to help immigrants and refugees. She also recognized the Salt Lake County Health Department for receiving the 2019 National Association of County and City Health Officials' "Local Health Department of the Year" award.

Mr. Steve Van Maren stated the Council should consider reappointment terms for Council Members on boards. As the electorate, it can choose whether or not to have term limits. The general public membership has terms based on bylaws.

Council Member Bradley stated this Saturday is the Salt Lake County Fair, at which he will be using the generous contribution from the Salt Lake County Council to buy animals from the 4-H program.

Council Member DeBry stated he was taken aback every time he heard about a mass shooting. Both parties have to come together to address the issue for the welfare and benefit of constituents. He called for a moment of silence for those who lost lives and for the first responders who have to go to those tragedies.

Council Member Ghorbani stated it is a very difficult and depressing time with what is happening in the country. While efforts are being made locally, people need to reach out to senators and representatives asking for more action, and they need to be more compassionate and less hateful in their day to day lives. One of the greatest tragedies here involving guns is suicide. She reminded everyone that gunlocks were available in all County libraries and they might prevent the death of someone struggling with suicide.

Council Member Burdick stated he attended the Salt Lake County Youth Government elections last Thursday night. Karen Hale, Special Initiatives Director, Mayor's Office, was also in attendance, as were Council Senior Policy Advisors Sam Klemm and Marla Kennedy who spoke to the youth. He felt better about the future of the world after talking to these youth leaders.

Council Member Granato announced tonight's Night Out Against Crime event hosted by the Unified Police Department's Millcreek Precinct. The event brings great resources and information to the public.

RESOLUTION NO. 5620

A RESOLUTION OF THE SALT LAKE COUNTY COUNCIL APPROVING THE FILING OF APPEALS BEFORE THE UTAH STATE TAX COMMISSION

IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE SALT LAKE COUNTY COUNCIL THAT:

WHEREAS, Utah Code §59-2-1007(2) allows a county to object to an assessment and request a hearing with the Utah State Tax Commission under certain circumstances;

WHEREAS, the Tax Commission's 2019 assessments appear below fair market value for the following airlines: Alaska Air Group, American Airlines, Delta Air Lines, Frontier Airlines, JetBlue Airways Corp, SkyWest, Southwest Airlines, and United Continental Holdings;

WHEREAS, PacifiCorp, SkyWest, and CenturyLink have filed an appeal for

their 2019 assessments and other taxpayer-initiated appeals are expected; and

WHEREAS, it is in the County's best interest that the County file appeals to protect the County's financial interests and the equality of the tax burdens of taxpayers within its jurisdiction.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Salt Lake County Council resolves as follows:

1. That the District Attorney has authority to file appeals for the 2019 property tax assessments of the following airlines: Alaska Air Group, American Airlines, Delta Air Lines, Frontier Airlines, JetBlue Airways Corp, Southwest Airlines, and United Continental Holdings;

2. That the District Attorney has authority to file appeals responding to PacifiCorp's, SkyWest's and Century Link's appeals;

3. That the District Attorney has authority to file protective appeals if any of the following initiate an appeal: Kennecott, Sprint, T-Mobile, Ulnion Pacific, Verizon, Graymont, and Chevron pipeline;

4. That the District Attorney has authority to file protective appeals to any other appeal initiated by a taxpayer, and that the County be permitted to join its appeals with appeals of other counties; and

5. That the County Mayor direct the appeals under the advice of the District Attorney.
