2.2 Notice of Proposed 2020 Tax Increase in Conformance With Utah Code Ann. Section 59-2-919(3)(a).

The County of Salt Lake is proposing to increase its property tax revenue. The County of Salt Lake tax on a \$368,000 residence would increase \$33.60 per year. The County of Salt Lake tax on a \$368,000 business would increase \$61.09 per year. Purpose of the proposed increase is to provide funding for services newly mandated by the State of Utah, to provide operations of new or expanded voter-approved facilities in Salt Lake County government and other essential purposes. **Approximate** percentage government increase property tax budgeted revenue would be 8.72% above 2019 property tax budgeted revenue excluding new growth.

He suggested the Council designate areas within Salt Lake County for tent cities. The designated areas should include a porta-potty as well as a garbage dumpster. This could serve as a temporary measure until something more could be done.

The bill mandates that the County create voter participation areas for the purposes of the local initiative process and the local referendum process. The resolution states the County will use the six Salt Lake County Council Districts as voter participation areas as permitted by state code.

Council Member Bradshaw asked if every part of Salt Lake County had to be in an area.

Mr. Jason Rose, Deputy District Attorney, stated yes, that is correct.

Ms. Kathleen Johnston, Director, Human Resources Division, delivered a PowerPoint presentation on the 2020 compensation and benefits recommendations. She reviewed the total compensation philosophy, recap of 2018 and 2019 compensation and benefits actions, and the recommended 2020 compensation and benefits budget recommendations.

Council Member Bradshaw stated he thought the living wage should be extended to all hourly part-time employees as well. He asked how this would

affect the budget.

Ms. Johnston stated there are approximately 3,200 temporary employees.

Mayor Jennifer Wilson stated her office did not have time to do an analysis on this; however, it will probably do so in future years.

Mr. Will Kocher, Council Administrative Assistant, introduced Brad Asay, President of American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees (AFSCME).

Mr. Brad Asay, President, AFSCME, stated he submitted a letter for the Council's review and would not be going over any additional information today.

Salt Lake County's Employee Representative, Utah Ms. Christy Berk, Public Employees' Association (UPEA), stated **UPEA** endorses the employee compensation proposal for the 2020 fiscal proposed year. However, if there is room in the budget, compression adjustments need to be further considered. This should include education on how these adjustments are determined.

Mr. Gerald Haskell, Executive Director, Utah Alliance of Government Employees (UAGE), stated overall the compensation plan is fair. However, the living wage of \$12.00 an hour and the 1 percent bonus for redlined employees should be closely reviewed.

Council Member Bradshaw asked if the Council should vote on the compensation package today.

Council Member Newton stated she was not ready to vote on this. She would like to explore the 2.75 percent increase for employees making a higher wage. Maybe the Council could consider a graduated salary increase, giving less to those that make more.

Mayor Jennifer Wilson stated if the Council wanted to say no to the tax increase, then it would have to say no to the compensation increase, new courts, and a well-run election.

Council Member Burdick stated the Council could still approve something in between. It can always come back and discuss this issue as well.

A motion was made by Council Member Bradshaw, seconded by Council Member Granato, that this agenda item be approved and forwarded to the 4:00 PM Council meeting. The motion carried 5 to 1 with Council Member Newton voting "Nay," and Council Member Snelgrove absent for the vote.
