As part of Salt Lake County's COVID response, the County has received, and continues to receive, an enormous amount of donations from private and non-profit entities. Because these were received in a state of emergency, and were being deployed at the same time, a detailed summary with quantities and values of every donation has not been created. If a more detailed summary is needed, it can be done, but would require additional staff time.

The purpose of this request (in the spirit of County Policy) is to put a broad summary of the donations before the County Council for recognition and approval.
