COVID-19 Pandemic increases risk for Housing Instability:

- Job Loss, Reduced Income and Health Concerns
- Housing Cost Burden
 - 290,00 Rental Households in Utah
 - 50,000 60,000 Rental Households at risk of eviction statewide
 - 135,000 Rental Households in Salt Lake County
 - 21,000 Households at risk of eviction in Salt Lake County



Between 20% and 25% of renters have been negatively impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic:

- Uncertainty of Income and Housing Instability
- Rents become due January 1, 2021

Current Mitigation:

- CARES Act provided Rental Assistance for households impacted by COVID-19 due to loss of income and/or denied unemployment
 - State of Utah allocated \$20 Million of CARES Act Funding for Rental Assistance
 - \$8.3 Million Designated for Salt Lake and Tooele Counties
 - Salt Lake County HOME Program provided tenant based Rental Assistance immediately after the April Shutdown in the amount of \$750,000
 - Salt Lake County allocated \$1.5 Million of CARES Act Funding in December due to current funding being exhausted. This additional funding will be exhausted within two weeks on the existing wait list applications for Rental Assistance



Pending Federal Legislation:

- COVID-19 Latest Stimulus Package
 - Extension of existing moratorium to January 31, 2021
 - \$25 Billion in Rental Assistance for arrears and current rent, Utilities arrears and other related Housing Stability services

Existing State Consideration:

- Commission on Housing Affordability submitted a request for \$7 Million to the Governor and Governor Elect for Rental Assistance for the month of January
- Evictions caused by COVID-19 seeking legislation to seal court evictions
