

History of Program:

- 1991 held first collection event 20,000 pounds collected
- 1996 SLCo facility was built
- 1998 2nd facility was built at TransJordan Landfill
- 2001 Murray ABOP (Antifreeze, Batteries, Oil and Paint)
- 2002 Library partnerships to collect lightbulbs
- 2006 Sandy ABOP (Antifreeze, Batteries, Oil and Paint)
- 2008 Collection of E-waste

Request funded by prior year Health Fund balance and HHW Assigned Fund.



Original project estimate completed prior to a site being finalized. During design, the project team determined site requirements exceeded original estimate – access roads, fencing, landscaping and storm drain needs.

Impacted by a robust construction market.

Project team will continue to design and construct a facility that meets all programmatic needs and is sustainable and energy efficient.
