## 3.1. Council Members

Council Member DeBry asked that this article be put on the Council website.

**Council Member Granato** thanked her colleagues for including her in the Unified Fire Authority presentation, and for their willingness to discuss a number of subjects. This reinforces the idea that the County Council works collaboratively, collegially, and across the aisle.

March 16, 2021

**Council Member Stringham** stated the board of the Greater Salt Lake Municipal Services District wanted to thank the Mayor and Council for the CARES Act funding, which has been a huge help to the metro townships.

**Council Member Bradley** reported on the Wasatch Front Waste & Recycling District (WFWRD), which is considering changing its district status to become independent of the County. This would involve many policy issues. He asked the Council Chair to reach out to the Mayor and put this on a future agenda for discussion.

### 3.2. Other Elected Officials

Mr. Ralph Chamness, Deputy District Attorney, stated his office is the recipient of a Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) grant and is required to report to the Council on the progress of the grant.

**Ms. Lorianne Szendre**, Victim Counseling Program Manager, District Attorney's Office, stated money from this grant is earmarked for the victims of crime and she described the various uses and services it provides.

**Ms.** Susanne Mitchell, Associate Division Director, Victim Support Services, District Attorney's Office, stated this grant also aids the Children's Justice Center. The center helps children who are victims of abuse. These children are traumatized, and the center is their first experience with the justice system.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE LEGISLATIVE BODY OF SALT LAKE

COUNTY. UTAH. 2.04.075 OF THE SALT **AMENDING** SECTION LAKE COUNTY CODE OF ORDINANCES, 2001, ENTITLED "WORK TO ESTABLISH THE OF THE MEETINGS" NAME SALT LAKE COUNCIL'S WEEKLY WORK **MEETING** AS COUNTY THE 'COUNCIL WORK SESSION.' OTHER AND UPDATING **SECTIONS** OF COUNTY ORDINANCE TO REFERENCE THE SAME

The County Legislative Body of Salt Lake County ordains as follows:

SECTION I. The amendments made herein are designated by underlining the new substituted words. Words being deleted are designated by brackets and strike-through.

SECTION II. Section 2.04.070, of the Salt Lake County Code of Ordinances, 2001 is hereby amended to read as follows:

2.04.075 - Council Meetings.

- A. All meetings of the council must be public except as provided in this chapter and by state law. Official action may be taken by the council only in open public meetings unless otherwise permitted by state statute.
- B. All regular meetings of the county council shall be conducted in Salt Lake City as the county seat of Salt Lake County. Special, committee, closed and emergency meetings may be held at other places provided that the proper notice is given of the time and place.
- C. The council shall conduct its business in accordance with Chapter 4 of Title 52. Utah Code Annotated, 1953, as amended, as it now exists or as it may hereinafter be amended, with respect to open and public meetings.
- D. The council conducts the following types of meetings:
  - 1. Regular meetings
  - 2. Special meetings
  - 3. Closed meetings
  - 4. [Committee of the whole] A weekly council work session meeting and other work session meetings of the council
  - 5. Emergency meetings
  - 6. Veto-override meetings

- 7. Other [M]meetings.
- E. The council shall give public written notice at least once each year of its annual meeting schedule for regular meetings. The public notice shall specify the date, time and place of such meetings.
- F. The council, by majority vote of the members present, may direct the removal of any person who [wilfully] willfully disrupts a council meeting to the extent that orderly conduct is seriously compromised.
- G. The attorney and auditor or their designees may attend and assist the council at all meetings, but shall attend and assist the council at all meetings when requested.

SECTION III. Section 2.04.075, of the Salt Lake County Code of Ordinances, 2001 is hereby amended to read as follows:

2.04.075 - Work meetings.

- A. The council conducts a regular work session <u>meeting</u>, referred to as the [committee of the whole] <u>council work session</u>, on Tuesdays in the County Government Center, at the hour and place designated by the council chair.
- B. [Committee of the whole] The council work session shall be scheduled or cancelled as the public business requires and shall consist of discussion, review, testimony, requests and information from county officers and employees, presentations by the public, review of regular meeting agendas, preparation for regular meetings, and such other matters and activities as may be necessary or scheduled by the council chair.
- C. [Committee of the whole] Council work session meetings shall be open to the public in accordance with state statute and public notice shall be given of all meetings in the same manner as required for regular meetings.
- D. Official actions, including council votes, may be undertaken in [Committee of the whole] council work session meetings.
- E. A quorum of council members is necessary to conduct [Committee of the whole] council work session meetings.

F. The Council may convene additional work session meetings as may be necessary at other dates, times, and places designated by the council chair.

SECTION IV. Section 2.08.060, of the Salt Lake County Code of Ordinances, 2001 is hereby amended to read as follows:

2.08.060 - Department, elected officer or mayor initiated policies and procedures.

Countywide policies and procedures proposed by the mayor, elected officials, officers of the executive office of the mayor, or department or division directors shall be sent to the council to be placed on the agenda of the next regular council work session [meeting of the council committee of the whole] and regular council meeting for formal consideration.

SECTION V. This ordinance shall become effective fifteen (15) days after its passage and upon at least one publication in a newspaper published and having general circulation in Salt Lake County.

#### RECITALS

- A. Salt Lake County (the "County") owns several parcels of real property located at approximately 10004 South 4800 West and 9800 South County Road (Parcel Nos. 26-12-400- 012 and 26-12-400-006 respectively) in South Jordan, Utah (the "Property"), which is part of the Bingham Creek Regional Park (the "Park").
- B. The County needs a new sewer line to provide sewer service to the Park.
- C. South Valley Sewer District (the "District") provides sewer services in the area where the Park is located.
- D. In order to receive sewer services from the District, the County has agreed to provide the District with a twenty-foot-wide perpetual non-exclusive easement (the "Easement") to allow for the construction, maintenance, and repair of the District's underground sewer line and related facilities (the "Sewer Facilities").
- E. The County and the District have prepared a Perpetual Easement Agreement (the "Agreement") wherein the County grants the Easement to the District for the construction, maintenance, and repair of the Sewer Facilities.
- F. It has been determined that connection to and future maintenance of the District's Sewer Facilities constitutes fair and adequate consideration for the grant of said Easement, and no other fee shall be required for the Easement because of the benefit the Sewer Facilities will provide to the Park.
- G. It has been determined that the best interests of the County and the general public will be served by granting the Easement to the District as provided in the Agreement attached hereto as Exhibit A. The execution of the Agreement will be in compliance with all applicable state statutes and county ordinances.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED by the Salt Lake County Council that the attached Agreement is accepted and approved, and the Mayor and County Clerk are hereby authorized to execute the Agreement and to deliver the fully executed document to the County Real Estate Division for to the District.
