








Pretrial: Non-financial release from jail by risk assessment; case managers assist client appearance in court by removing barriers (transportation, technical assistance, court date reminders).




COVID: Increased the number of pretrial supervisions; both pretrial release and judge ordered release. Court closures and hearing continuances have increased the length of time on pretrial release.



Pretrial Risk Assessment

Pretrial utilizes an evidence-based assessment called the Public Safety Assessment [PSA].

This assessment is used to determine supervision level.







Probation:

Supervision of Class A Misdemeanor and lower convictions (DUI, Drug Possession, Domestic Violence, Assault, Theft, etc.). Supervision is based in the individual's risk – the higher the risk the more time/resources are needed.

Success Rate:

By utilizing evidence-based practices and focusing on the top criminogenic needs, case managers are having greater success with clients.











Treatment Courts

A collaborative approach to addressing clients' substance use and mental health disorders. The focus is accountability and treatment over prison or jail sentences.






COVID:

By utilizing evidence-based practices and focusing on the top criminogenic needs, case managers are having increased success with clients.


Demographic Dashboard January 1, 2021 - Present






Self-Sufficiency Matrix January 1, 2021 - Present
